Establishes "New Jersey Higher Education Funding Formula Commission."

CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT

As reported by the Senate Higher Education Committee on June 15, 2021, with amendments.

1 AN ACT establishing the "New Jersey Higher Education Funding Formula Commission."

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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7 1. There is established a New Jersey Higher Education Funding 8 Formula Commission. The commission shall consist of 11 9 members including: the Secretary of Higher Education, or a 10 designee, who shall serve ex-officio; the executive director of the 11 Higher Education Student Assistance Authority, or a designee, who 12 shall serve ex-officio; five members to be appointed by the Governor including a representative of the State colleges and 13 universities established pursuant to chapter 64 of Title 18A of the 14 15 New Jersey Statutes, a representative of the public research 16 universities, a representative of the county colleges, a representative 17 of the independent colleges and universities, and one public 18 member; one member to be appointed by the President of the Senate; one member to be appointed by the Minority Leader of the 19 20 Senate; one member to be appointed by the Speaker of the General 21 Assembly; and one member to be appointed by the Minority Leader 22 of the General Assembly.

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- 2. It shall be the duty of the commission to:
- a. examine higher education funding formulas ¹for institutions of higher education, including medical schools, law schools, and graduate schools, ¹ in other states, ¹[including a thorough] ¹ review ¹[of] ¹ performance-based funding formulas ¹in other states ¹, and identify best practices;
- b. solicit and review detailed information from all of the State's institutions of higher education ¹, including medical schools, law schools, and graduate schools, ¹ on their funding needs, programs and operations, and outputs; and
- c. develop a report that includes a higher education funding formula for the State support of ¹<u>all</u> institutions of higher education ¹, including medical schools, law schools, and graduate schools ¹. The report may include such recommendations for legislative or regulatory action as the commission deems appropriate.

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3. Appointments to the commission shall be made within 30 days of the effective date of this act. Vacancies in the membership of the commission shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointments were made. The members of the commission shall

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serve without compensation but shall be entitled to reimbursement for expenses actually incurred in the performance of their duties within the limits of funds made available to the commission for its purposes. The members of the commission shall hold their initial

The members of the commission shall hold their initial organizational meeting as soon as practicable, but no later than 30 days following the appointment of the members.

The commission shall choose a chairperson from among its members and shall appoint a secretary who need not be a member of the commission.

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4. Staff and related support services shall be provided to the commission by the Office of the Secretary of Higher Education. The commission shall also be entitled to call to its assistance and avail itself of the services of the employees of any State, county or municipal department, board, bureau, commission or agency as it may require and as may be available to it for its purposes.

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5. The commission shall issue a final report of its findings and recommendations, including any recommended legislation, to the Governor, the Senate Higher Education Committee, and the Assembly Higher Education Committee no later than six months after its organizational meeting.

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6. This act shall take effect immediately and the commission shall expire 30 days after the submission of the final report.
