SYNOPSIS

Concerns delivery and sale of alcoholic beverages during declared state of emergency; exempts alcohol used by distillery in production of hand sanitizer from alcoholic beverage tax.

1 AN ACT concerning the delivery and sale of alcoholic beverages 2 during a state of emergency. 3 4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 5 of New Jersey: 6 7 1. As used in this act: 8 "Craft manufacturer license" means a plenary winery license, farm 9 winery license, out-of-State winery license, limited brewery license, 10 cidery and meadery license, and craft distillery license issued pursuant to R.S.33:1-10. 11 12 "Retail consumption license or permit" means a plenary retail 13 consumption license, plenary retail consumption license used in connection with a hotel or motel, or seasonal retail consumption 14 15 license issued pursuant to R.S.33:1-12 or a concessionaire permit 16 issued pursuant to Title 33 of the Revised Statutes that authorizes the 17 sale of all alcoholic beverages for consumption on the licensed 18 premises. "State of emergency" means the state of emergency declared by 19 20 the Governor pursuant to Executive Order No. 103 of 2020 in 21 response to the COVID-19 pandemic. 22 23 2. a. Notwithstanding the provisions of R.S.33:1-12 or any other 24 law to the contrary, the holder of a retail consumption license or 25 permit shall be entitled to: 26 (1) sell any alcoholic beverages on the licensed premises in 27 original containers or in other closed and sealed containers for consumption off the licensed premises during a state of emergency; 28 29 and 30 (2) deliver, by common carrier or otherwise, any alcoholic 31 beverages to the residence of a consumer within this State who is 21 32 years of age or older in original containers or in other closed and 33 sealed containers for consumption off the licensed premises during a 34 state of emergency. 35 b. Distilled alcoholic beverages sold or delivered in closed and sealed containers pursuant to this section may be mixed or blended 36 37 with other alcoholic or nonalcoholic beverages. Any container in which alcoholic beverages are sold or 38 c. 39 delivered pursuant to this section shall be affixed with a tamper 40 evident seal and may be of any size, except that containers, other than 41 original containers, in which any distilled alcoholic beverages are 42 sold or delivered pursuant to this section, whether or not mixed or blended with other beverages, shall have a maximum capacity of 16 43 44 fluid ounces. 45 46 3. a. Notwithstanding the provisions of R.S.33:1-10 or any other law to the contrary, the holder of a craft manufacturer license shall 47

48 be entitled to deliver, by common carrier or otherwise, the licensee's

1 products to the residence of a consumer within this State who is 21 2 years of age or older in original containers for personal consumption 3 and not for resale during a state of emergency. 4 b. Nothing in this section shall be construed to limit or otherwise 5 affect sales or delivery privileges otherwise established by statute, rule, or regulation for any license issued pursuant to R.S.33:1-10. 6 7 8 4. a. The privileges established pursuant to sections 2 and 3 of 9 this act shall remain in effect until the: (1) date of expiration, 10 termination, or rescission of any executive or administrative orders 11 issued by the Governor or Commissioner of Health establishing 12 coronavirus-related occupancy or customer seating restrictions applicable to licensed premises; or (2) the first day of the seventh 13 14 month following the date on which the Governor declares that the 15 state of emergency has ended, whichever date occurs later. 16 b. Notwithstanding any provision of the "Administrative 17 Procedure Act," P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et seq.), the director may adopt rules, issue special rulings, or establish guidelines 18 19 regarding the sale or delivery of alcoholic beverages authorized 20 pursuant to this act. 21 22 5. a. As used in this section, "exemption period" means the 23 period of time during the state of emergency as defined by this act 24 and any extension thereof. 25 b. The tax imposed pursuant to the "Alcoholic Beverage Tax 26 Law," R.S. 54:41-1 et seq. shall not apply to the sale or delivery of alcohol used by a distillery in the production of hand sanitizer for the 27 28 duration of the exemption period. 29 A distillery shall be entitled to a refund for the alcoholic c. 30 beverage tax paid on alcohol used by the distillery in the production 31 of hand sanitizer during the exemption period. The application for a 32 refund shall be submitted to the Division of Taxation in the 33 Department of the Treasury, in a form and manner as prescribed by 34 the Director of the Division of Taxation. 35 d. Notwithstanding any provision of the "Administrative 36 Procedure Act," P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et seq.) to the contrary, 37 the Director of the Division of Taxation in the Department of the 38 Treasury is authorized to adopt immediately upon filing with the 39 Office of Administrative Law rules and regulations necessary to 40 implement this section, which rules and regulations shall be effective for a period not to exceed 360 days following the date of filing and 41 42 may thereafter be amended, adopted, or readopted by the director in 43 accordance with the requirements of P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et 44 seq.). 45 46 6. This act shall take effect immediately and shall expire on: (a) the date of expiration, termination, or rescission of any and all 47 48 executive or administrative orders issued by the Governor or

Commissioner of Health establishing coronavirus-related occupancy

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or customer seating restrictions applicable to licensed premises; or
(b) the first day of the seventh month following the date on which the
Governor declares that the state of emergency has ended, whichever
date occurs later.

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STATEMENT

8 This bill allows for the sale and delivery of alcoholic beverages 9 by the holders of certain retail consumption licenses and 10 concessionaire permits during the state of emergency declared by the 11 Governor pursuant to Executive Order No. 103 of 2020 in response 12 to the COVID-19 pandemic. In addition, the bill allows certain 13 alcoholic beverage manufacturers to deliver, by common carrier or 14 otherwise, their products to the residences of consumers in original 15 containers or any closed and sealed container during the state of 16 emergency.

17 Under the bill, the holder of plenary retail consumption licenses, 18 hotel or motel licenses, seasonal retail consumption licenses, or 19 concessionaire permits, generally issued to bars and restaurants, 20 would be permitted to sell and deliver alcoholic beverages in original 21 containers or any closed and sealed container for consumption off the 22 licensed premises during the state of emergency. In addition, the 23 holder of a limited brewery license, plenary winery license, farm 24 winery license, out-of-State winery license, cidery and meadery 25 license, or craft distillery license would be permitted to deliver the 26 licensee's products in original containers for consumption off the 27 licensed premises during the state of emergency.

28 The bill also temporarily allows the holder of retail consumption 29 license or concessionaire permit to sell cocktails for off-premises 30 consumption. Specifically, distilled alcoholic beverages sold by the 31 holder of a retail consumption license or concessionaire permit in a 32 closed and sealed container may be mixed or blended with other 33 alcoholic or nonalcoholic beverages. The bill requires distilled 34 alcoholic beverages, whether or not mixed with other beverages, to 35 be delivered or sold in closed and sealed containers that hold not 36 more than 16 fluid ounces. Any other alcoholic beverage may be 37 sold or delivered in containers of any size. The closed and sealed 38 containers are to be affixed with a tamper evident seal.

Finally, the bill exempts from the alcoholic beverage tax, alcohol used by a distillery in the sale, delivery, and production of hand sanitizer during a state of emergency and allows refunds for those distilleries that have paid the tax on alcohol used by the distillery in the production of hand sanitizer during the state of emergency.

This temporary enactment has an effective date that expires six months following the date: (1) on which the state of emergency has ended; or (2) on which the coronavirus-related occupancy or customer seating restrictions no longer apply to these licensed premises, whichever date occurs later.
