## **SYNOPSIS**

Appropriates \$5 million in federal funds to Department of Health for grants and stipends to ensure health and safety of farm workers.

## **CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT**

As reported by the Senate Economic Growth Committee on July 22, 2020, with amendments.

AN ACT concerning protective health materials for farm workers, and making an appropriation.

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> **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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7 There is appropriated from the General Fund to the 1. a. Department of Health the sum of \$5 million from a portion of those 8 federal block grant funds allocated to the State from the federal 9 10 "Coronavirus Relief Fund," established pursuant to the federal "Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act," Pub.L.116-11 12 136, for use by the department to provide financial assistance in the 13 form of grants to an owner or operator of a farm for the purchase <sup>1</sup><u>or reimbursement</u><sup>1</sup> of personal protection equipment to be provided 14 15 to farm workers at that farm to protect against the COVID-19 virus. The Commissioner of Health may also, at the commissioner's 16 discretion, provide grants for the purchase <sup>1</sup>or reimbursement<sup>1</sup> of 17 other items or materials that would improve the health and safety of 18 farm workers during the COVID-19 pandemic <sup>1</sup>, including 19 improvements made, or the planning of improvements, to housing 20 and work stations during the COVID-19 pandemic 21

22 The Commissioner of Health may also issue stipends to 23 farmworkers who get tested for the COVID-19 virus, test positive, 24 and are subject to a period of mandatory quarantine, but who do not 25 qualify for paid sick leave or unemployment insurance during a 26 period of mandatory quarantine. The amount of any such stipend 27 should be equal to half of the total pay that a farm worker would 28 ordinarily receive for two weeks of work with their current farm 29 employer. A stipend may not be awarded more than one time per 30 individual<sup>1</sup>.

31 b. The Department of Health shall provide notice on its Internet 32 website of the availability of funding for the purchase of personal 33 protection equipment, or other health and safety items or materials, 34 for farm workers pursuant to this section. An owner or operator of 35 a farm may apply for a grant in the form and manner prescribed by the department. 36

c. As used in this section:

38 "Farm worker" means any employee engaged to labor on a farm 39 in the production, harvesting, and processing of agricultural 40 products, and shall include any employee subject to the provisions 41 of subsection d. of section 5 of P.L.1966, c.113 (C.34:11-56a4).

42 "Personal protection equipment" means equipment, such as 43 gloves and masks, to minimize the spread of disease.

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2. This act shall take effect immediately.
