- 7 1. a. Notwithstanding any provision of law, rule, or regulation 8 to the contrary, the Director of the Division of Purchase and Property 9 in the Department of the Treasury, in consultation with the 10 Commissioner of the Department of Education, shall award a 11 contract or contracts, in accordance with the provisions of chapter 34 12 of Title 52 of the Revised Statutes, for the procurement of COVID-13 19 related goods and services, as specified by the commissioner, that 14 aid in meeting the COVID-19 guidelines issued by the Centers for 15 Disease Control and Prevention. The director, in consultation with 16 the commissioner, may make awards to multiple bidders in 17 accordance with section 1 of P.L.1986, c.26 (C.52:34-12.1). 18 Advertised bidding shall not be required to award a contract or 19 contracts to obtain those goods and services necessary to address the 20 public exigency when the Division of Purchase of Property provides 21 preapproval.
  - b. The board of education of a school district, without advertising for bids, or after having rejected all bids obtained pursuant to advertising therefor, may purchase COVID-19 related goods and services, upon adoption of a resolution, through the contract or contracts for such goods and services entered into by the Division of Purchase and Property pursuant to the provisions of subsection a. of this section.
  - c. The Department of Education shall coordinate the purchase of COVID-19 related goods and services by school districts that seek to purchase the goods and services in accordance with subsection b. of this section.

#### d. As used in this section:

"Board of education" means and includes the board of education of any local school district, consolidated school district, regional school district, county vocational school and any other board of education or other similar body, other than the State Board of Education, the Commission on Higher Education or the Presidents' Council, established and operating under the provisions of Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes and having authority to make purchases and to enter into contracts for the provision or performance of goods or services. The term "board of education" also shall include the board of trustees of a charter school established under P.L.1995, c.426 (C.18A:36A-1 et seq.).

"School district" means a local or regional school district established pursuant to chapter 8 or chapter 13 of Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes, a county special services school district established pursuant to article 8 of chapter 46 of Title 18A of the New

6	2. This act shall take effect immediately and shall expire on July
7	1, 2022.

10	STATEMENT
11	
12	This bill requires the State to award a contract for the purchase
13	COVID-19 related goods and services by school districts. The goods
14	and services would include medical supplies and devices, among
15	other things. The State would not be limited to awarding contracts
16	to one bidder. If it is deemed advantageous, the State may award
17	contracts to more than one bidder to fill the necessary demand for
18	COVID-19 related goods and services.
19	School districts throughout the State would then be permitted to
20	purchase the goods and services under the contract. Under the bill,
21	the Commissioner of the Department of Education would be required
22	to coordinate the purchase of goods and services by the school
23	districts.
24	This bill would expire on July 1, 2022.
