SYNOPSIS

Authorizes MVC to use stored driver's license or identification card photo for longer than eight years; limits certain appointment times at MVC locations to senior citizens and persons with certain medical conditions during COVID-19 pandemic.

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AN ACT concerning ²driver's licenses and identification cards and² 1 temporary service measures for certain New Jersey Motor 2 Vehicle Commission customers in response to the COVID-19 3 public health emergency and state of emergency ², and amending 4 P.L.1979, c.261 and P.L.1980, c.47². 5 6 7 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 8 of New Jersey: 9 ²[1. Notwithstanding the provisions of R.S.39:3-10 and section 10 11 4 of P.L.1980, c.47 (C.39:3-29.5) to the contrary, any holder of a driver's license or non-driver identification card, which shall expire 12 on or before January 1, 2022, ¹[and]¹ who is 65 years of age or 13 older on ¹[the effective date of this act] January 1, 2022¹ shall not 14 be required to renew the driver's license or identification card until 15 January 2, 2022.]² 16 17 ²1. Section 1 of P.L.1979, c.261 (C.39:3-10f) is amended to read 18 19 as follows: 20 1. In addition to the requirements for the form and content of a 21 motor vehicle driver's license under R.S.39:3-10 and a probationary 22 license issued under section 4 of P.L.1950, c.127 (C.39:3-13.4), on 23 and after the operative date of P.L.2001, c.391 (C.39:3-10f4 et al.), 24 each initial New Jersey license, each renewal of a New Jersey 25 driver's license, and each probationary license shall have a digitized 26 photograph of the licensee. All licenses issued on and after January 27 1, 2000 shall be valid for a period of 48 calendar months. However, 28 the chief administrator may, at the chief administrator's discretion, 29 issue licenses and endorsements that shall expire on a date fixed by 30 the chief administrator. The fee for those licenses or endorsements 31 shall be fixed in amounts proportionately less or greater than the fee 32 otherwise established. Notwithstanding the provisions of this 33 section to the contrary, a person 70 years of age or older may elect 34 to have a license issued for a period of two or four years, which 35 election shall not be altered by the chief administrator. The fee for the two-year standard license shall be \$9, in addition to the fee for a 36 37 digitized photograph established in section 4 of P.L.2001, c.391 38 (C.39:3-10f4). The fee for a two-year REAL ID license shall be 39 \$14.50, in addition to the fee for a digitized photograph established 40 in section 4 of P.L.2001, c.391 (C.39:3-10f4). The chief 41 administrator may, for good cause, extend a license and any 42 endorsement thereon beyond their expiration dates for periods not The chief administrator may 43 to exceed 12 additional months.

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extend the expiration date of a license and any endorsement thereon without payment of a proportionate fee when the chief administrator determines that the extension is necessary for good cause. If any license and endorsements thereon are so extended, the licensee shall pay upon renewal the full license fee for the period fixed by the chief administrator as if no extension had been granted.

7 Each initial driver's license issued to a person under the age of 21 after the effective date of P.L.1999, c.28 (C.39:3-10f1 et al.) 8 9 shall be conspicuously distinct, through the use of color and design, 10 from the driver's licenses issued to persons 21 years of age or older. The chief administrator, in consultation with the Superintendent of 11 12 State Police, shall determine the color and the manner in which the license is designed to achieve this result. The license shall bear the 13 words "UNDER 21" in a conspicuous manner. 14 The chief 15 administrator shall provide that, upon attaining the age of 21, a 16 licensee shall be issued a replacement driver's license or a new 17 license, as appropriate. The fee for a replacement license shall be 18 \$5 in addition to the digitized photograph fee.

19 As [conditions] <u>a condition</u> for the renewal of a driver's license, 20 the chief administrator shall provide that the photograph of a 21 licensee be updated, except that the chief administrator may elect to 22 use a stored photograph [to renew a license for a period not 23 exceeding four additional years for two consecutive four-year 24 renewal periods for \$18 for a standard license per renewal and \$29 25 for a REAL ID license per renewal, in addition to the digitized 26 photograph fee. The chief administrator shall not use a stored 27 photograph for more than 12 years except as otherwise provided in 28 this section.

29 The holder of a standard basic driver's license who is 65 years of
 30 age or older shall not be required to update the person's driver's
 31 license photograph upon renewal and shall be eligible to use a
 32 stored photograph for each standard driver's license renewal.

33 In addition to any other extension, the chief administrator shall 34 allow a person to use a stored photograph to renew a license for a 35 period not exceeding one year if the person presents documentation 36 by a licensed physician that the person is undergoing medical 37 treatment for an illness and the treatment results in temporary 38 changes to the person's physical characteristics. The fee for this 39 extension shall be \$18 for a standard license and \$29 for a REAL 40 ID license and the person shall not be required to pay the digitized 41 photograph fee pursuant to section 4 of P.L.2001, c.391 (C.39:3-42 10f4).

Whenever a person has reconstructive or cosmetic surgery which significantly alters the person's facial features, the person shall notify the chief administrator who may require the photograph of the licensee to be updated for \$5 in addition to the digitized photograph fee. Nothing in this section shall be construed to alter or change any expiration date on any New Jersey driver's license issued prior to the operative date of P.L.2001, c.391 (C.39:3-10f4 et al.) and, unless a licensee's driving privileges are otherwise suspended or revoked, except as provided in R.S.39:3-10, that license shall remain valid until that expiration date.

Specific use of the driver's license and any information stored or
encoded, electronically or otherwise, in relation thereto shall be in
accordance with P.L.1997, c.188 (C.39:2-3.3 et seq.) and the federal
"Driver's Privacy Protection Act of 1994," Pub.L.103-322.
Notwithstanding the provisions of any other law to the contrary, the
digitized photograph or any access thereto or any use thereof shall
not be sold, leased, or exchanged for value.²

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²2. Section 4 of P.L.1980, c.47 (C.39:3-29.5) is amended to read
 as follows:

18 4. a. Except as provided in subsection b. of this section, each 19 original identification card authorized by section 2 of P.L.1980, 20 c.47 (C.39:3-29.3) shall, unless canceled earlier or otherwise 21 provided, expire during the fourth calendar year following its date 22 of issuance and on the same calendar day as the person's date of 23 birth. If the date of birth of the bearer of the identification card 24 does not correspond to a calendar day of the fourth calendar year, 25 the identification card shall expire on the last day of the birth month 26 of the bearer of the card.

27 The identification card shall be renewable upon the request of the bearer of the card, pursuant to terms of license renewal 28 29 established by the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission, and 30 upon payment of a fee as required by section 6 of P.L.1980, c.47 31 (C.39:3-29.7). An identification card issued pursuant to P.L.1980, 32 c.47 (C.39:3-29.2 et seq.) to an applicant who is blind or who has a 33 disability shall be valid for the life of the holder unless canceled by 34 the holder. Cards issued prior to October 16, 1989 and valid upon 35 the effective date of P.L.1990, c.30 shall be valid for the life of the 36 holder unless canceled by the holder. Cards issued to persons with 37 blindness or disabilities between October 16, 1989 and the effective 38 date of P.L.1990, c.30, and which are valid on the effective date of 39 P.L.1980, c.47 (C.39:3-29.2 et seq.), shall be made valid for the life 40 of the holder unless canceled by the holder, upon presentation of 41 proof that the person's blindness or disability existed at the time of 42 the original application. The chief administrator is authorized to 43 require periodic verification of information included on any 44 identification card issued for or valid for the life of the holder. 45 Nothing in this section shall be construed to alter or change any 46 expiration date on any New Jersey identification card issued prior to 47 the operative date of P.L.2001, c.391 (C.39:3-10f4 et al.) and any 48 such identification card shall remain valid until its expiration date.

1 As a condition for the renewal of an identification card, the chief 2 administrator shall provide that the photograph of a holder of an 3 identification card be updated, except that the chief administrator 4 may elect to use a stored photograph for two consecutive four-year 5 renewal periods. The chief administrator shall not use a stored photograph for more than 12 years except as otherwise provided in 6 7 this section. The fee shall be \$18 for a standard identification card 8 per renewal and \$29 for a REAL ID identification card per renewal, 9 in addition to the digitized photograph fee.

10 <u>The holder of a standard identification card who is 65 years of</u> 11 <u>age or older shall not be required to update the person's</u> 12 <u>identification card photograph upon renewal and shall be eligible to</u> 13 <u>use a stored photograph for each standard identification card</u> 14 <u>renewal.</u>

15 b. If the chief administrator issues a REAL ID identification 16 card to a person who has demonstrated authorization to be present 17 in the United States for a period of time shorter than the standard 18 periods of identification cards, the chief administrator shall fix the 19 expiration date of the REAL ID identification card at a date based 20 on the period in which the person is authorized to be present in the 21 United States under federal immigration laws. The chief 22 administrator may renew such REAL ID identification card only if 23 it is demonstrated that the person's continued presence in the United 24 States is authorized under federal law.²

(New section)</u>² ¹[The] <u>During the public health</u> 27 emergency and state of emergency declared on March 9, 2020 by 28 the Governor, pursuant to Executive Order No. 103 and extended, 29 where applicable, by subsequent executive orders, the¹ Chief 30 31 Administrator of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission shall reserve one day per week ¹<u>or a certain time each day or each week</u>¹, 32 to be determined by the chief administrator, at '[all] certain' 33 commission agency locations¹, to be determined by the chief 34 <u>administrator</u>,¹ to offer appointments ¹[for service]¹ exclusively to 35 36 ¹the following individuals to register a newly purchased ²[or],² <u>newly acquired</u>², or transferred² motor vehicle: 37

38 (1) any person who is 65 years of age or older; and

 $(2)^{1}$ any customers who, due to a medical condition diagnosed by 39 40 a licensed medical doctor or licensed osteopathic physician and 41 evidenced by proof, in a form prescribed by the chief administrator, 42 cannot, as a result of the medical condition, wear a mask or face covering¹[, during the public health emergency and state of 43 44 emergency declared on March 9, 2020 by the Governor, pursuant to 45 Executive Order No. 103 and extended, where applicable, by 46 subsequent executive orders $]^1$.

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²[3.] <u>4.</u>² This act shall take effect immediately and ²<u>section 3</u> 1 of this act² shall expire ²[on January 2, 2022] at the end of the 2 public health emergency caused by the Coronavirus disease 2019 3 (COVID-19), either: upon the expiration of Executive Order No. 4 5 103 of 2020 and any subsequent executive orders extending the public health emergency; or, in the absence of a rescission by the 6 7 Governor, upon the termination in any other manner of the declared public health emergency². 8
