SYNOPSIS

Temporarily extends deadline to register vehicle and obtain driver's license for new State residents during COVID-19 public health emergency.

CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT

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AN ACT providing temporary extension of vehicle registration and
 driver's license deadlines for new State residents.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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7 1. a. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 1 of 8 P.L.1955, c.53 (C.39:3-17.1) to the contrary, any person who becomes 9 a resident of this State and who immediately prior thereto was 10 authorized to operate and drive a motor vehicle or motor vehicles in 11 this State as a non-resident pursuant to R.S.39:3-15 and R.S.39:3-17, 12 shall not lose the right to so operate and drive a motor vehicle or motor 13 vehicles by becoming a resident of this State, but that right shall 14 continue to be in full force and effect for 120 days, unless a longer period of reciprocity is otherwise provided by law, after establishing 15 16 residency in this State in the same manner and to the same extent as 17 though the person was a non-resident.

18 b. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 1 of P.L.1955, c.53 19 (C.39:3-17.1) to the contrary, any person who becomes a resident of 20 this State and who immediately prior thereto was authorized to operate 21 and drive a motor vehicle or motor vehicles in this State as a non-22 resident pursuant to R.S.39:3-15 and R.S.39:3-17, shall register any 23 vehicle operated on the public highways of this State within 120 days 24 of so becoming a resident of New Jersey, pursuant to R.S.39:3-4 or 25 section 2 of P.L.1968, c.439 (C.39:3-8.1).

26 The extension of nonresident driving rights provided in c. 27 subsection a. and subsection b. of this section shall apply to persons 28 who become residents of the State during the period of time in which 29 the public health emergency caused by the Coronavirus disease 2019 30 (COVID-19), established by Executive Order No. 103 of 2020, and 31 any subsequent executive orders extending the public health emergency, remains in effect ¹, except that the extension may be 32 33 discontinued and the statutory 60-day period reinstated by the Chief 34 Administrator of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle upon written certification by the chief administrator that the extension is no longer 35 necessary and upon submission of that certification to the Governor 36 37 and, pursuant to section 2 of P.L.1991, c.164 (C:52:14-19.1), to the Legislature¹. 38

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2. This act shall take effect immediately and shall expire at the
end of the public health emergency caused by the Coronavirus
disease 2019 (COVID-19), either upon the expiration of Executive
Order No. 103 of 2020 and any subsequent executive orders
extending the public health emergency; or, in the absence of a
rescission by the Governor, upon the termination in any other
