AN ACT establishing a Teacher ²[Apprenticeship] <u>Residency</u>² 1 2 Program and supplementing chapter 6 of Title 18A of the New 3 Jersey Statutes. 4 5 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 6 of New Jersey: 7 8 1. As used in this act: 9 "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Education. 10 "Field experience" means observing and assisting with student learning which may include, but is not limited to, providing 11 12 operational support to public schools; assisting instructional staff 13 with data entry, grading, lesson planning, parental communication, 14 and assessment development; and conducting classroom instruction. ²"Non-certificated staff member" means a member of the staff, 15 16 including a paraprofessional, of any public school holding office, position, or employment of such character that the qualifications, 17 for such office, position, or employment, do not require the staff 18 member to hold a valid and effective standard, provisional, or 19 emergency certificate issued by the State Board of Examiners.² 20 "Paraprofessional" means an individual who is employed in a 21 22 public school as a school aide or classroom aide who assists a 23 teaching staff member with the supervision of pupil activities. "Program" means the Teacher ²[Apprenticeship] <u>Residency</u>² 24 25 Program established pursuant to section 2 of this act. "Program participant" means a public high school student 26 27 entering grade 12² and who has been accepted into the Teacher <u>Residency Program, or</u>² a ² [paraprofessional with] <u>non-certificated</u> 28 staff member who has obtained a minimum of 60 college credits or² 29 an associate degree who has been accepted into the Teacher 30 ²[Apprenticeship] Residency² Program. 31 "Public school" means a school district, charter school, and 32 33 renaissance school in the State. 34 "Secretary" means the Secretary of Higher Education. 35 2. The Commissioner of Education, in coordination with the 36 Secretary of Higher Education, shall establish a Teacher 37 ²[Apprenticeship] Residency² Program, the purpose of which shall 38 be to offer stipends and provide program participants with the 39 education and field experience necessary to obtain a New Jersey 40 41 certificate of eligibility with advanced standing. 42 43 3. a. not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

1 approved educator preparation program that wish to offer the Teacher ² [Apprenticeship] <u>Residency</u>² Program shall jointly apply 2 to the Department of Education in such manner as determined by 3 4 the commissioner in consultation with the secretary. The 5 application shall include, but not be limited to: 6 (1) a dual enrollment agreement between the public school and 7 institution of higher education; 8 (2) the number of teachers in the public school and faculty at the 9 institution of higher education available to provide college level 10 instruction in connection with the program; and 11 (3) a program implementation plan which includes information 12 on the types of services in place to support students enrolled in the 13 program. 14 b. A public school and institution of higher education selected 15 to offer the program shall jointly enter into an agreement with the 16 department in which the public school and institution of higher 17 education agree to provide program participants with the education 18 and field experience necessary to obtain a certificate of eligibility 19 with advanced standing. 20 4. The Teacher ²[Apprenticeship] <u>Residency</u>² Program shall 21 be comprised of three stages during which a program participant 22 shall complete the coursework and field experience necessary to 23 24 obtain a certificate of eligibility with advanced standing. 25 a. Stage one of the program shall be open to high school 26 students entering grade 12. A program participant who completes 27 stage one of the program shall be awarded a ²[School Apprentice] Teacher Trainee² credential. In order to complete stage one, a 28 program participant shall: 29 (1) earn ²[30] <u>a minimum of 15^2 college credits in accordance</u> 30 with State Board of Education regulations; 31 (2) author a literature review on a topic approved by the 32 program participant's academic advisor; $^{2}and^{2}$ 33 (3) perform 200 hours of field experience²[; and 34 (4) pass a commissioner-approved paraprofessional general 35 36 aptitude exam]². 37 b. Stage two of the program shall be open to individuals with a <u>Teacher</u> Trainee² ²[School Apprentice] credential 38 and ²[paraprofessionals with] <u>non-certificated staff members who have</u> 39 obtained a minimum of 60 college credits or² an associate degree. 40 A program participant ²<u>enrolled in an educator preparation</u> 41 $\underline{\text{program}}^{2}$ who completes stage two of the program shall be awarded 42 a Teacher ²[Apprentice] Resident² I credential. In order to 43 complete stage two, a program participant shall: 44 45 (1) earn a cumulative total of 90 college credits in accordance

46 with State Board of Education regulations;

(2) perform ²[1500] <u>a minimum of 720</u>² hours of field 1 experience ² [per year]²; and 2 (3) pass an appropriate State test of subject matter knowledge. 3 Stage three of the program shall be open to individuals with 4 c. a Teacher ² [Apprentice] <u>Resident</u>² I credential. 5 A program participant who completes stage three of the program shall be 6 7 awarded a Teacher ² [Apprentice] <u>Resident</u>² II credential. In order to complete stage three, the program participant shall: 8 9 (1) earn a cumulative total of 120 college credits in accordance with State Board of Education regulations; 10 (2) perform ²[1500] a minimum of 1000² hours of field 11 experience ²[per year]²; 12 (3) complete ${}^{2}an$ educator preparation program and ${}^{2}all$ 13 14 necessary requirements for and obtain a bachelor's degree; and 15 commissioner-approved (4) pass performance-based a 16 assessment. d. An individual who possesses a Teacher ²[Apprentice] 17 <u>Resident²</u> II credential awarded pursuant to the provisions of this 18 act and meets the general certification requirements including, but 19 20 not limited to, citizenship, age, and examination requirements, 21 established by the State Board of Education shall be eligible for a 22 certificate of eligibility with advanced standing. 23 24 5. To be eligible to participate in the program, an applicant 25 shall: be a resident of New Jersey; 26 a. 27 if a high school student: b. 28 (1) pass a background check administered by the Department of 29 Education; and (2) have a minimum cumulative grade point average of a 3.0 on 30 31 a scale of 4.0, or its equivalent, at the time of application to the 32 program; and c. if a ²[paraprofessional with] <u>non-certificated staff member</u> 33 who has obtained a minimum of 60 college credits or² an associate 34 degree, have ²[graduated from a county college with] <u>maintained</u>² 35 a minimum cumulative grade point average of a 3.0 on a scale of 36 4.0, or its equivalent ²while enrolled in or upon graduation from an 37 institution of higher education, as applicable². 38 39 40 6. a. A high school student who wishes to participate in the 41 program shall submit an application to the public school in which 42 the student is enrolled and to the institution of higher education that 43 has partnered with the public school to offer the program. The 44 application, which shall be submitted by the end of the fall semester 45 of the applicant's junior year of high school, shall include: 46 (1) an official high school transcript;

1 (2) a personal statement detailing the applicant's reasons for 2 applying to the program; 3 (3) two letters of recommendation; and (4) any other information the commissioner and secretary deem 4 5 appropriate. b. A ²[paraprofessional with] <u>non-certificated staff member</u> 6 who has obtained a minimum of 60 college credits or² an associate 7 degree who wishes to participate in the program shall submit an 8 application to the public school in which the ²[paraprofessional] 9 <u>non-certificated staff member</u>² is employed or to a public school 10 ²[located in the school district in which the paraprofessional 11 resides] offering the Teacher Residency Program² and to the 12 institution of higher education that has partnered with the public 13 school to offer the program. ²An application shall be accepted in a 14 manner determined by the partnering public school and institution 15 of higher education.² The application shall include 2 , but not be 16 limited to, the following²: 17 (1) official transcripts from each ²[county college] <u>institution</u> 18 of higher education² the ² [paraprofessional] <u>non-certificated staff</u> 19 member² has attended; 20 (2) a personal statement detailing the applicant's reasons for 21 22 applying to the program; 23 (3) three letters of recommendation, one of which shall be from 24 a current supervisor, principal, or employing public school's human 25 *resource officer;* and 26 (4) any other information the commissioner and secretary deem 27 appropriate. c. The public school and the institution of higher education that 28 29 has partnered with the public school shall jointly select the 30 applicants for participation in the program. 31 ²d. As a condition of acceptance into the program, a program 32 participant shall enter into an agreement with the Department of 33 Education to maintain employment as a teaching staff member in 34 the State for four years following completion of the program. A 35 program participant who is unable to obtain employment as a 36 teaching staff member in the State following completion of the 37 program may seek a waiver from the department exempting the 38 program participant from the provisions of this paragraph. The department shall establish guidelines governing the provisions of 39 this subsection.² 40 41 7. a. A program participant shall receive ²[a yearly]² stipend 42 ²[award] <u>awards</u>² which shall be distributed in such manner as 43 44 determined by the commissioner and secretary. The total amounts 45 awarded shall be:

46 (1) \$2,000 during stage one of the program;

(2) \$10,000 ² [per year]² during stage two of the program; and 1 2 (3) \$15,000 during stage three of the program. 3 b. In order to receive the full amount of the stipend award 4 during stages two and three of the program, a program participant shall be enrolled full-time in a course of study at the ²[four-year]² 5 6 institution of higher education that has partnered with the public 7 school under the program and complete all required hours of field 8 experience. c. ²[Pursuant to criteria established by the commissioner, in 9 consultation with the secretary, a partial distribution of the stipend 10 11 award may be authorized when a program participant is unable to 12 enroll full-time in a course of study or fails to complete the required 13 hours of field experience] The commissioner and secretary may 14 determine to provide additional stipend awards to a program 15 participant whose course of study while enrolled in the program 16 may lead to a subject area endorsement in any subject area in which 17 there is a shortage of teachers in the State as determined by the commissioner². 18 19 8. A program participant, as a condition of participation, shall 20 be required to adhere to performance standards established by the 21 22 commissioner in coordination with the secretary. The standards 23 shall include, but not be limited to, requirements that a program 24 participant: 25 a. maintain residency in the State; 26 maintain a cumulative grade point average of a 3.0 or higher b. on a scale of 4.0, or its equivalent, while enrolled in the program; 27 28 and 29 c. maintain satisfactory performance of field experience 30 services rendered during the program. 31 32 9. The State Board of Education, in consultation with the 33 Office of the Secretary of Higher Education, shall adopt, in 34 accordance with the "Administrative Procedures Act," P.L.1968, 35 c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et seq.), rules and regulations as may be 36 necessary to implement the provisions of this act. 37 38 ¹<u>10. This act shall take effect on the first day of the 13th month</u> 39 next following the date of enactment, except the Commissioner of 40 Education, in consultation with the Secretary of Higher Education, 41 may take any anticipatory administrative action in advance as shall

42 <u>be necessary for the timely implementation of this act.</u>¹
