Establishes "Community Broadband Study Commission."

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AN ACT establishing the "Community Broadband 1 Study 2 Commission. 3 4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 5 of New Jersey: 6 7 1. a. There is established the "Community Broadband Study 8 Commission." The commission shall consist of 11 members as 9 follows: 10 (1) the President of the Board of Public Utilities, ex officio, or 11 the president's designee, who shall serve as chairperson of the 12 commission; 13 (2) the Chief Technology Officer of the Office of Information 14 Technology, ex officio, or the officer's designee; 15 (3) the Director of the Division of Rate Counsel, ex officio, or 16 the director's designee; 17 (4) one member of the Senate to be appointed by the President 18 of the Senate; 19 (5) one member of the General Assembly to be appointed by the 20 Speaker of the General Assembly; 21 (6) three public members to be appointed by the President of the 22 Senate, who shall include an individual with expertise in 23 community broadband networks and infrastructure and an 24 individual with expertise in municipal and county governance or 25 public utilities, with one individual residing in the northern region 26 of the State, one individual residing in the central region of the 27 State, and one individual residing in the southern region of the 28 State: and 29 (7) three public members to be appointed by the Speaker of the 30 General Assembly, who shall include at least one individual with 31 expertise in community broadband networks and infrastructure and 32 an individual with expertise in municipal and county governance or 33 public utilities, with one individual residing in the northern region 34 of the State, one individual residing in the central region of the 35 State, and one individual residing in the southern region of the 36 State. 37 b. Any vacancy in the membership of the commission shall be 38 filled in the same manner in which the original appointment was 39 made 40 c. Members of the commission shall serve without 41 compensation but shall be reimbursed for necessary and reasonable expenses incurred in the performance of their duties pursuant to this 42 act within the limits of funds appropriated or otherwise made 43 44 available to the commission for its purposes. 45 d. For the purposes of this act, "community broadband 46 network" means a local shared network consisting of a series of 47 interlinked computers that allow persons with devices connected to 48 a wired network within the area served to gain entry to the wider

1 Internet through high speed Internet service connections at 2 designated access points.

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The commission shall organize as soon as possible after the 4 2. 5 appointment of a majority of the commission's members and shall meet at the call of the chairperson at the times and in the places it 6 7 may deem appropriate and necessary to fulfill its duties.

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9 3. The commission shall evaluate the feasibility of establishing 10 community broadband networks in this State. The commission shall be responsible for, but not be limited to, the following: 11

12 (1) considering whether leasing or purchasing established 13 broadband infrastructure, such as, but not limited to, unused fiber optic cable and unused broadcast television signal space, is more 14 15 advantageous in creating a faster network;

16 (2) considering whether establishing a community broadband 17 municipal or county agency or a non-profit corporation is more 18 appropriate to administer the community broadband network;

(3) evaluating the different methods, including legislation and 19 20 contracts with private companies, that other municipalities or 21 counties in this country have used to implement community 22 broadband networks;

23 (4) determining the most cost effective method in which to 24 establish community broadband networks, with a cost estimate for 25 the local government and a rate estimate for paying customers; and

26 (5) exploring all possible federal, State, and private funding 27 sources for the establishment of community broadband networks in this State. 28

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30 The commission shall be entitled to call to its assistance and 4 31 avail itself of the services of the officials and employees of the State and its political subdivisions and their departments, boards, 32 33 bureaus, commissions, and agencies as it may require and as may be 34 available to it for the purposes of the commission. The Board of Public Utilities shall provide staff support services to the 35 commission. 36

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38 5. The commission shall report its findings, conclusions, and 39 recommendations to the Governor and, pursuant to section 2 of 40 P.L.1991, c.164 (C.52:14-19.1), to the Legislature no later than one 41 year following the first meeting of the commission. The 42 commission shall expire upon the submission of the commission's 43 report, pursuant to this section.

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45 6. This act shall take effect immediately and shall expire upon 46 the submission by the commission of its report pursuant to section 5 of this act. 47

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STATEMENT

This bill establishes the "Community Broadband Study 3 4 Commission" (commission). Under the bill, the commission is to 5 evaluate the feasibility of establishing community broadband 6 networks in this State and is responsible for the following: 1) 7 considering whether leasing or purchasing established broadband 8 infrastructure, such as, but not limited to, unused fiber optic cable 9 and unused broadcast television signal space, is more advantageous 10 in creating a faster network; 2) considering whether establishing a 11 community broadband municipal or county agency or a non-profit 12 corporation is more appropriate to administer the community 13 broadband network; 3) evaluating the different methods, including 14 legislation and contracts with private companies, that other 15 municipalities or counties in this country have used to implement 16 community broadband networks; 4) determining the most cost 17 effective method in which to establish community broadband 18 networks, with a cost estimate for the local government and a rate 19 estimate for paying customers; and 5) exploring all possible federal, 20 State, and private funding sources for the establishment of 21 community broadband networks in the State.

The commission is to report its findings, conclusions, and recommendations to the Governor and the Legislature no later than one year following the first meeting of the commission. The commission is to expire upon the submission of the commission's report.
