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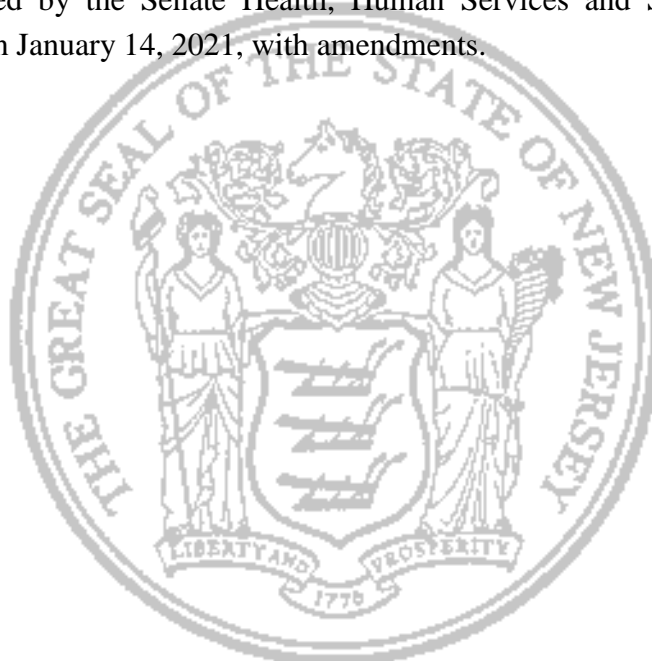

SYNOPSIS

Requires DOH to establish certain nursing education and professional advancement programs.

CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT

As reported by the Senate Health, Human Services and Senior Citizens Committee on January 14, 2021, with amendments.

1 AN ACT concerning nursing education and professional
2 advancement and supplementing Title 26 of the Revised Statutes.

4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
5 of New Jersey:

7 1. a. The Department of Health, in consultation with the
8 Association for Professionals in Infection Control and
9 Epidemiology, shall develop an infection prevention course
10 specifically designed for ¹licensed practical nurses and¹ registered
11 nurses employed in a long-term care facility. The Department of
12 Health shall develop methods to encourage and incentivize
13 ¹licensed practical nurses and¹ registered nurses to complete the
14 infection prevention course. The infection prevention course shall
15 include, but shall not be limited to, instruction on the following
16 topics:

17 (1) modes of transmission, incubation periods, host resistance,
18 and susceptibility to various infections and communicable diseases;

19 (2) appropriate measures to prevent the spread of infection;

20 (3) processes used to sterilize, disinfect, and sanitize a health
21 care facility;

22 (4) management and communication skills necessary for the
23 coordination of an effective infection prevention program;

24 (5) regulations which govern infection prevention practice; and

25 (6) criteria for identifying health care associated infections in
26 patients.

27 b. (1) The Department of Health, in consultation with the
28 Board of Nursing, shall review ¹the current¹ nursing curriculum and
29 develop methods to encourage ¹licensed practical nurses and¹
30 registered nurses to enroll in ¹education and training on¹ post-acute
31 care **1**¹**【residency programs】**¹; and

32 (2) The Department of Health, in consultation with the Board of
33 Nursing, shall review the educational and clinical experience
34 requirements for the completion of a nursing degree and determine
35 if the requirements should be modified to better prepare ¹licensed
36 practical nurses and¹ registered nurses to work in post-acute care
37 settings.

39 2. a. The Department of Health shall develop an infection
40 prevention course for certified nurse aides. The Department of
41 Health shall include the infection prevention course as a required
42 component of annual in-service education for certified nurse aides.
43 The infection prevention course shall include, but shall not be
44 limited to, instruction on the following topics:

11 b. The Department of Health shall review 'the' current
12 certified nurse aide curriculum, incorporate an infection prevention
13 component into the curriculum, and make any other necessary
14 modifications to the curriculum.

16 3. The Department of Health, in consultation with one or more
17 long-term care facilities in this State and representatives of labor
18 organizations, shall establish a pilot program to develop standards
19 for the professional advancement of certified nurse aides. The
20 standards for the professional advancement of certified nurse aides
21 may be based on: previous work experience, education level,
22 participation in educational opportunities, training, and work
23 performance. The standards for the professional advancement of
24 certified nurse aides may also be based on any applicable out-of-
25 State models for the professional advancement of certified nurse
26 aides.

27
28 4. The Commissioner of Health shall adopt rules and
29 regulations, in accordance with the "Administrative Procedure Act,"
30 P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et seq.), as are necessary to effectuate
31 the provisions of this act.

32
33 5. This act shall take effect immediately.
