1	AN ACT concerning renewable energy systems in new State
2	buildings and supplementing Title 52 of the Revised Statutes.

4	BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
5	of New Jersey:
6	
7	1. a. The Division of Property Management and Construction
8	in the Department of the Treasury shall require that all newly
9	constructed State buildings include the installation and operation of
10	renewable energy systems powered by solar and geothermal energy
11	sources, where feasible. Renewable energy systems shall be
12	designed to provide all or a portion of the heating, cooling, or
13	general electrical energy needs of these buildings.
14	b. As used in this section:
15	"Geothermal energy" means heat derived from the earth that can
16	be harnessed for electricity production, direct heat, or heat pump
17	use.
18	"Solar energy" means energy which has recently originated in the
19	sun, including direct and indirect solar radiation and intermediate
20	solar energy from wind and sea thermal gradients.
21	"State building" means a building that is built, owned, and
22	operated by a State agency.
23	
24	2. This act shall take effect immediately.

27	STATEMENT
28	
29	This bill would require that, where feasible, the construction of
30	all new State buildings include the installation of renewable energy
31	systems powered by solar and geothermal energy sources.
