Requires Commissioner of Education to develop bicycle safety program for students enrolled in grades kindergarten through 12.

1 AN ACT concerning bicycle safety of students and supplementing 2 chapter 6 of Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes. 3 4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 5 of New Jersey: 6 7 1. a. The Commissioner of Education shall develop a bicycle safety program. The purpose of the program shall be to educate 8 9 students in grades kindergarten through 12 on the safe use of 10 bicycles as a healthy mode of transportation and source of 11 recreation. The program shall include, but need not be limited to, a 12 review of: (1) existing State laws, rules, and regulations relating to bicycle 13 use, including the State's requirement that a minor child wear a helmet 14 15 when riding a bicycle pursuant to section 1 of P.L.1991, c.465 (C.39:4-16 10.1); 17 (2) ways cyclists can improve their visibility and predictability 18 to drivers; (3) road rules and safe cycling behavior, including the proper 19 20 use of designated bicycle lanes and hand signals; and (4) road hazards such as inclement weather, unexpected car door 21 22 openings, and distracted cycling through use of cell phones or 23 music applications while cycling. 24 b. The commissioner shall make the program available to each 25 board of education and shall provide school districts with sample 26 learning activities and resources. 27 2. This act shall take effect on the 60th day after the date of 28 29 enactment. 30 31 **STATEMENT** 32 33 34 This bill directs the Commissioner of Education to develop a bicycle safety program that will educate students in grades 35 kindergarten through 12 on the safe use of bicycles.
