Authorizes purchaser of automobile by private sale to operate automobile for three-day period following purchase without permanent registration or transfer of title.

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

1. a. Any resident of this State purchasing a passenger
automobile pursuant to a private sale in this State from any person
who is not a dealer or used motor vehicle dealer, and provided the
automobile is to be principally garaged, registered, and titled in this
State, may register the automobile in New Jersey on a temporary
basis.

13 b. A temporary registration pursuant to this section shall be 14 made through an application submitted to the New Jersey Motor 15 Vehicle Commission through the commission's website, with an 16 electronic signature by the applicant, that requires the applicant to 17 submit the applicant's name, address, and age, the automobile 18 seller's name, a description of the character of the automobile 19 including the make and model of the automobile and vehicle 20 identification number, the date of the private sale, the odometer reading at the time of sale, the name of the insurance company 21 insuring the automobile, the insurance policy number, a 22 23 certification by the applicant that the automobile is insured in 24 accordance with the requirements of the "Motor Vehicle Security-25 Responsibility Law," P.L.1952, c.173 (C.39:6-23 et seq.), and any 26 other information that may be required by the Chief Administrator 27 of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission. In the event that the insurance is terminated, the insurer shall notify the chief 28 29 administrator within 30 days following the termination. The 30 commission shall maintain a record of all temporary registration 31 applications made pursuant to this section, store this information in 32 a database or registry, and make this information accessible to law 33 enforcement officers. Immediately upon submission of the 34 application, the commission shall provide a receipt to the applicant 35 through electronic mail that may serve as proof of temporary 36 registration pursuant to this section.

37 c. Following submission of the application, the applicant may 38 operate the automobile on the roadways of this State for a period of 39 three days from submission of the application, provided that the 40 automobile is insured in accordance with the requirements of the 41 "Motor Vehicle Security-Responsibility Law," P.L.1952, c.173 42 (C.39:6-23 et seq.), notwithstanding that the automobile does not 43 have a permanent registration and may not be properly titled with 44 A law enforcement officer shall review the the commission. 45 database or registry maintained by the commission or the receipt 46 provided to the applicant by electronic mail pursuant to subsection 47 b. of this section to confirm the temporary registration status of the 48 automobile. Following the three-day period, the automobile shall

not be operated on the roadways of this State unless it is registered
pursuant to R.S.39:3-4 or properly registered in another state or
jurisdiction.

d. Any person violating the provisions of this section shall be
subject to a fine not exceeding \$100, except that for the intentional
misstatement of any fact in the application required to be made by
the chief administrator, the person making the misstatement shall be
subject to the penalties provided in R.S.39:3-37.

10 2. During the public health emergency declared on March 9, 11 2020 by the Governor, pursuant to Executive Order No. 103 and 12 extended, where applicable, by subsequent executive orders, the Chief Administrator of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission 13 14 may extend the period that persons may operate automobiles 15 purchased pursuant to private sale that are temporarily registered 16 pursuant to section 1 of P.L., c. (C.) (pending before the 17 Legislature as this bill) on the roadways of this State to a period not 18 to exceed 10 days from the submission of the application pursuant 19 to section 1 of P.L., c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature 20 as this bill), provided that the automobile is insured in accordance 21 with the requirements of the "Motor Vehicle Security-22 Responsibility Law," P.L.1952, c.173 (C.39:6-23 et seq.).

3. This act shall take effect on the first day of the third month
following enactment, except that the Chief Administrator of the
New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission shall take anticipatory
action in advance thereof to ensure the timely implementation of
this act.

STATEMENT

This bill authorizes a person who purchases a passenger automobile through a private sale from a person who is not a dealer or used motor vehicle dealer to operate the automobile on the roadways in the State for a period of three days, provided that the automobile is properly insured and that person temporarily registers the automobile pursuant to the bill.

39 In order to be authorized to operate an automobile in such a 40 manner, the automobile purchaser is required to submit information 41 to the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission (commission) 42 through the commission's website. Once that information is 43 submitted, the commission is required to provide the person with a 44 receipt by electronic mail that proves that the person temporarily 45 registered the automobile with the commission, which may serve as 46 proof of the registration status of the automobile. The commission 47 is required to maintain the information submitted through the

website in a database or registry, which is to be accessible to law
 enforcement officers.
 Any person violating the provisions of the bill is to be subject to
 a fine up to \$100. Any person that provides an intentional

a fine up to \$100. Any person that provides an intentional
misstatement of any fact is subject to the penalties provided by law
concerning the provision of falsified information to the commission.

7 The bill also includes a temporary provision that authorizes the 8 chief administrator to expand the three-day time period under the 9 bill to a 10-day time period during the Coronavirus disease 2019

10 public health emergency.
