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- **STATEMENT**
- This bill appropriates \$35 million in federal funds to the 38 Economic Development Authority (EDA) to award grants for the 39

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public purpose of supporting an important part of the State's 1 economy affected by the public health crisis. The grants will be 2 3 awarded by the EDA to restaurants and bars with fewer than 100 4 employees and who are in need of support as a result of the public 5 health crisis.
