SYNOPSIS

Expands volunteer tuition credit program to volunteers and eligible dependents enrolled in four-year public institutions of higher education and increases maximum value of tuition credit.

CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT

1 AN ACT concerning the volunteer tuition credit program and 2 amending P.L.1998, c.145. 3 4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 5 of New Jersey: 6 7 1. Section 1 of P.L.1998, c.145 (C.18A:71-78.1) is amended to 8 read as follows: 9 1. A person who is an active member of a volunteer fire 10 company or volunteer first aid or rescue squad or association in good standing and the dependent children and spouse of a volunteer 11 12 shall be allowed to enroll in a postsecondary program on a tuition-13 free basis in a county college, county vocational school [or], 14 county technical institute, or four-year public institution of higher 15 education and be eligible to receive tuition credit in an amount not to exceed a maximum of [\$2,400] <u>\$4,000</u> for the member, children 16 17 and spouse; provided that available classroom space permits and 18 that tuition paying students constitute the minimum number 19 required for the course. Nothing herein shall preclude a county 20 college, county vocational school [or], county technical institute, or four-year public institution of higher education from requiring 21 registration and lab fees for individuals attending courses pursuant 22 23 to this act. 24 (cf: P.L.1998, c.145, s.1) 25 26 2. Section 2 of P.L.1998, c.145 (C.18A:71-78.2) is amended to 27 read as follows: 28 2. In order to be eligible to receive tuition credit at a county college, county vocational school [or], county technical institute, 29 30 or four-year public institution of higher education, a person shall 31 agree to serve as a member of a volunteer fire company or volunteer 32 first aid or rescue squad or association for a minimum of four years 33 and sign an agreement with the municipality in which the squad or 34 association is located pledging four years of service in exchange for Following each year of volunteer service 35 the tuition credit. performed, the volunteer or the spouse or dependent child shall be 36 37 entitled to receive tuition credit of up to [\$600] <u>\$1,000</u>, not to 38 exceed a maximum of [\$2,400] <u>\$4,000</u> for the member, children 39 and spouse over a four-year service period. 40 (cf: P.L.1998, c.145, s.2) 41 42 3. 1 year public institution of higher education, the volunteer, dependent 2 child or spouse shall provide verification to the institution that the 3 volunteer has performed the service required for the tuition credit. Upon completion of each semester, the volunteer shall submit a 4 5 transcript to the municipality to be maintained in a permanent 6 record. The volunteer or the dependent child or spouse shall 7 maintain a "C" grade average in order to continue eligibility for the 8 tuition credit program. 9 (cf: P.L.1998, c.145, s.3) 10 11 4. This act shall take effect immediately and shall first apply to 12 the first full academic year following the date of enactment. 13 14 15 **STATEMENT** 16 17 Through the Volunteer Tuition Credit Program, an active 18 member of a volunteer fire company or volunteer first aid or rescue squad, and the dependent children and spouse of a volunteer, may 19 20 enroll in a postsecondary program on a tuition-free basis in a county 21 college, county vocational school, or county technical institute and be eligible to receive tuition credit in an amount not to exceed \$600 22 23 per year, provided that available classroom space permits and that 24 tuition paying students constitute the minimum number required for 25 the course. The maximum value of the tuition credit available 26 through the program is currently set at \$2,400 over a four-year 27 period of eligibility. 28 This bill expands the program to volunteers, and their dependent 29 children and spouses, who enroll in a four-year public institution of 30 higher education. This bill also increases the maximum value of the 31 tuition credit available through the program to \$1,000 per year, for 32 a maximum total tuition credit of \$4,000 over four years of 33 eligibility.
