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AN ACT concerning eligibility for the Pharmaceutical Assistance to 1 2 the Aged and Disabled program and amending P.L.1975, c.194. 3 4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 5 of New Jersey: 6 7 1. Section 2 of P.L.1975, c.194 (C.30:4D-21) is amended to 8 read as follows: 9 2. a. Any resident of this State who is either a recipient of 10 disability insurance benefits under Title II of the federal Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. s. 401 et seq.) or 65 years of age and over 11 12 and whose annual income is less than [\$16,624] <u>\$38,769</u> if single or, if married, whose annual income combined with that of his 13 14 spouse is less than [\$20,383] <u>\$45,270</u>, shall be eligible for 15 "Pharmaceutical Assistance to the Aged and Disabled" if he is not 16 otherwise qualified for assistance under P.L.1968, c.413 (C.30:4D-17 1 et seq.). Annual income shall not include gain from the sale of a 18 principal residence that is excluded from gross income pursuant to 19 N.J.S.54A:6-9. 20 b. ¹[Beginning] (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of 21 this subsection, beginning¹ January 1, 1996 and annually thereafter, the income eligibility limits provided in subsection a. of this section 22 23 shall increase by the amount of the maximum Social Security 24 benefit cost-of-living increase for that year for single and married 25 persons, respectively. The commissioner shall adopt the new 26 limits annually by regulation income pursuant to the "Administrative Procedure Act," P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-27 28 1 et seq.). 29 ¹(2) No cost-of-living increase shall be applied under paragraph 30 (1) of this subsection in calendar year 2022. The cost-of-living increase shall resume beginning January 1, 2023, and the income 31 32 eligibility limits shall be annually increased thereafter consistent 33 with the requirements of paragraph (1) of this subsection.¹ (cf: P.L.1995, c.27, s.1) 34 35 36 2. This act shall take effect on January 1, 2022, but the Commissioner of Human Services may take such anticipatory 37 administrative action in advance as shall be necessary for the 38 implementation of the act. 39
