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AN ACT concerning school bus safety and supplementing chapter 39
 of Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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7 1. a. There is established in but not of the Department of Education the Office of the School Bus Safety Ombudsman. For 8 9 the purpose of complying with the provisions of Article V, Section 10 IV, paragraph 1 of the New Jersey Constitution, the Office of the School Bus Safety Ombudsman is hereby allocated within the 11 12 Department of Education, but notwithstanding this allocation, the 13 office shall be independent of any supervision or control by the department or any board or officer thereof, or any other cabinet-14 15 level department, board, or officer thereof. The purpose of the 16 office is to oversee the school busing industry and to coordinate 17 enforcement and accountability among the department, school bus 18 drivers, school bus contractors, and the New Jersey Motor Vehicle 19 Commission.

b. The Governor shall appoint a School Bus Safety
Ombudsman, who shall be qualified by training and experience to
perform the duties of the office. The ombudsman shall be a person
of recognized judgment, integrity, and objectivity, and shall be
skilled in communication, conflict resolution, and professionalism.

c. The ombudsman shall organize and direct the work of the
office, including the work of such professional and clerical staff as
may be necessary to carry out the ombudsman's duties.

2. a. The duties of the School Bus Safety Ombudsman shall30 include, but not be limited to, the following:

(1) review a school bus driver's information collected by the
Commissioner of Education pursuant to section 6 of P.L.1989,
c.104 (C.18A:39-19.1);

34 (2) review all training certifications for school bus drivers from
35 employers pursuant to subsection b. of section 2 of P.L.2015, c.123
36 (C.18A:39-19.3);

37 (3) assist in the development of a student information card
38 pursuant to section 3 of P.L.2015, c.123 (18A:39-19.4);

(4) review statements provided by a board of education or
contractor that verify a school bus driver, whose bus driver's
license is suspended or revoked, no longer operates a school bus for
the board or contractor pursuant to section 1 of P.L.2018, c.152
(C.18A:39-19.6);

(5) the establishment of a publicly accessibly database that compiles the violations and subsequent fines of school bus drivers, school bus contractors that employ the school bus drivers, and the owners, operators, or any officers associated with the school bus contractor. The ombudsman shall develop and implement an appeal mechanism to resolve any dispute raised by a school bus driver,

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1 school bus contractor, or owner, operator, or officer associated with 2 a school bus company concerning inclusion in the database; 3 (6) maintain a list of all persons barred from bidding on any 4 pupil transportation contract pursuant to section 3 of P.L. . C. 5 (C.) (pending before the Legislature as Assembly Bill No. 5818 or Senate Bill No. 3849 of 2021); 6 7 (7) render a decision as to whether a person shall be debarred 8 from bidding on a pupil transportation contract pursuant to the 9 provisions of P.L., c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature 10 as Assembly Bill No. 5818 or Senate Bill No. 3849 of 2021); 11 (8) collect and review the name, address, and contact 12 information of school bus contractors and the owners of school bus 13 contracting companies; 14 (9) determine if a board of education or contractor has failed to 15 comply with the provisions of N.J.S.18A:39-20; 16 (10) review and recommend changes to the commissioner of the 17 rules and regulations governing school bus safety; and 18 any other duties the ombudsman deems appropriate to (11)ensure the safety of school buses for students in the State. 19 20 b. The ombudsman shall treat communications received in the course of the ombudsman's duties, including personally identifiable 21 information regarding students, parents or guardians, school bus 22 23 drivers, and others from whom information is acquired, as 24 confidential, except when disclosure is necessary to enable the 25 ombudsman to perform the duties of the office and consent for 26 disclosure is obtained. Upon receipt of information that by law is confidential or privileged, the ombudsman shall maintain the 27 confidentiality of such information and shall not disclose or 28 29 disseminate the information except as provided by applicable State 30 or federal law. 31 c. As used in this section, "person" means an individual and 32 any business, including any corporation, partnership, association, or 33 proprietorship in which such individual is a principal, or with 34 respect to which the individual owns, directly or indirectly, or 35 controls any of the stock or other equity interest of such business. 36 37 3. The ombudsman shall submit an annual report to the 38 Governor, the Legislature pursuant to section 2 of P.L.1991, c.164 39 (C.52:14-19.1), and the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission 40 which includes a summary of the services provided, and 41 enforcement actions taken, by the ombudsman during the school 42 year, and any specific recommendations the ombudsman deems 43 appropriate and necessary concerning the oversight and 44 management within the ombudsman's purview. 45 46 4. STATEMENT

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This bill creates the School Bus Safety Ombudsman position in, but not of, the Department of Education to monitor and administer all school bus safety and oversight activities. The School Bus Safety Ombudsman will be appointed by the Governor and will have, but not be limited to, the following duties:

review a school bus driver's information collected by the
Commissioner of Education for a criminal history check or
check for alcohol and drug-related motor vehicle violations
pursuant to current statute;

- review all training certifications for school bus drivers from employers;
 - assist in the development of a student information card;
- review statements provided by a board of education or
 contractor that verify a school bus driver, whose bus driver's
 license is suspended or revoked, no longer operates a school
 bus for the board or contractor;
- the establishment of a publicly accessibly database that
 compiles the violations and subsequent fines of a school bus
 driver, the school bus contractor that employs the school bus
 driver, and any owner, operator, or officer associated with
 the school bus contractor. The ombudsman will develop and
 implement an appeal mechanism to resolve any dispute
 raised concerning inclusion in the database;
 - maintaining a list of persons debarred from bidding on pupil transportation contracts;
 - render a decision as to whether a person shall be debarred from bidding on a pupil transportation contract;
 - collect and review the name, address, and contact information of school bus contractors and the owner or school bus contracting companies;
 - determine if a board of education or contractor has approved or assigned an unauthorized bus driver;
 - review and recommend changes to the commissioner of the rules and regulations governing school bus safety; and
 - any other duties the ombudsman deems appropriate to ensure the safety of school buses for students in the State.

The bill also requires the ombudsman to submit an annual report to the Governor, the Legislature, and the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission which includes a summary of the services provided, and enforcement actions taken, by the ombudsman during the school year, and any specific recommendations the ombudsman deems appropriate and necessary concerning the oversight and management within the ombudsman's purview.
