SYNOPSIS

Expresses approval of Legislature for a 90-day extension of certain administrative orders, directives, and waivers issued in response to COVID-19 Public Health Emergency.

CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION expressing the approval of the 2 Legislature for a 90-day extension of certain administrative 3 orders, directives, and waivers issued in response to the COVID-4 19 Public Health Emergency.

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- WHEREAS, On March 9, 2020, in response to coronavirus disease (COVID-19), the Governor issued Executive Order No. 103, declaring the existence of a public health emergency, pursuant to the "Emergency Health Powers Act" (EHPA), P.L.2005, c.222 (C.26:13-1 et seq.), and a state of emergency, pursuant to the New Jersey Civilian Defense and Disaster Control Act (Disaster Control Act), P.L.1942, c.251 (C.App.A:9-33 et seq.), in the State of New Jersey; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Section 3 of P.L.2005, c.222 (C.26:13-3) establishes that a public health emergency declared by the Governor shall 16 automatically terminate after 30 days, unless renewed for an 17 additional 30 days through a declaration of the Governor; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Through Executive Order Nos. 119, 138, 151, 162, 171, 19 180, 186, 191, 200, 210, 215, 222, 231, 235, and 240, issued on 20 April 7, 2020, May 6, 2020, June 4, 2020, July 2, 2020, August 1, 21 2020, August 27, 2020, September 25, 2020, October 24, 2020, 22 November 22, 2020, December 21, 2020, January 19, 2021, 23 February 17, 2021, March 17, 2021, April 15, 2021, and May 14, 24 2021, respectively, the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency was 25 extended, and all executive orders and administrative orders 26 adopted in whole or in part in response to the COVID-19 Public 27 Health Emergency remained in full force and effect; and
- WHEREAS, As COVID-19 continued to spread across New Jersey, the 28 29 Governor issued a series of executive orders pursuant to the 30 Governor's authority under the EHPA and the Disaster Control Act, 31 including Executive Order Nos. 104-133, Nos. 135-138, Nos. 140-166, Nos. 168-173, No. 175, Nos. 177-181, No. 183, Nos. 186-187, 32 33 Nos. 189-198, No. 200, Nos. 203-204, No. 207, and Nos. 210-211 34 (2020) and Nos. 214-216, Nos. 219-220, Nos. 222-223, No. 225, 35 Nos. 228-235, Nos. 237-244, No. 246, No. 249, Nos. 251- 253, Nos. 263-264, Nos. 266-267, and No. 271 (2021); and 36
- 37 WHEREAS, On June 4, 2021, the Governor signed into law P.L.2021, c.103 and issued Executive Order No. 244, which terminated the 38 39 public health emergency declared in Executive Order No. 103 40 (2020) but maintained the state of emergency declared in that same 41 Order; and
- WHEREAS, P.L.2021, c.103 further provides that, following the 42 termination of the public health emergency, the force and effect of 43 44 any administrative order, directive, or waiver issued by the head of 45 a State agency that relied on the existence of the public health 46 emergency declared by the Governor in Executive Order No. 103 of 2020, as extended, shall expire on January 11, 2022; and 47

- 1 WHEREAS, Subsection b. of section 3 of P.L.2021, c.103 provides 2 that the Legislature may pass a concurrent resolution to continue for 3 90 days beyond January 11, 2022 any administrative order, directive, or waiver issued by the head of a State agency that relied 4 5 on the existence of the public health emergency declared by the Governor in Executive Order No. 103 of 2020, as extended, for 6 7 which the Governor has determined an extension is necessary or 8 appropriate and has provided notice to the Legislature on or before 9 January 1, 2022; and
- WHEREAS, The Governor has provided notice pursuant to the provisions of P.L.2021, c.103 for the extension of certain administrative orders, directives, and waivers enumerated in this concurrent resolution to protect the public health, safety, and welfare against the emergency created by COVID-19; now, therefore,

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BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the State of New Jersey (the General Assembly concurring):

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15	STATEMENT
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17	Under current law (P.L.2021, c.103), the COVID-19 Public
18	Health Emergency ended on July 4, 2021, except that certain
19	administrative orders, directives, and waivers issued in response to
20	the public health emergency were extended until January 11, 2022.
21	However, current law also provides that following the termination
22	of the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency, the Governor must
23	notify the Legislature by January 1, 2022 if the Governor
24	determines that it is necessary or appropriate to continue for an
25	additional 90 days beyond January 11, 2022 any administrative
26	order, directive, or waiver issued by the head of a State agency that
27	relied on the existence of the public health emergency. Under
28	current law, the administrative orders, directives, or waivers would
29	be extended for an additional 90 days if each House of the
30	Legislature passes a concurrent resolution to continue the
31	administrative order, directive, or waiver.
32	Due to the surge in COVID-19 cases, hospitalizations, and
33	deaths in this State, the Legislature concurs with the Governor's
34	recommendation that certain administrative orders, directives, and
35	waivers issued in response to the COVID-19 Public Health
36	Emergency be extended and remain in full force and effect until
37	April 11, 2022.
