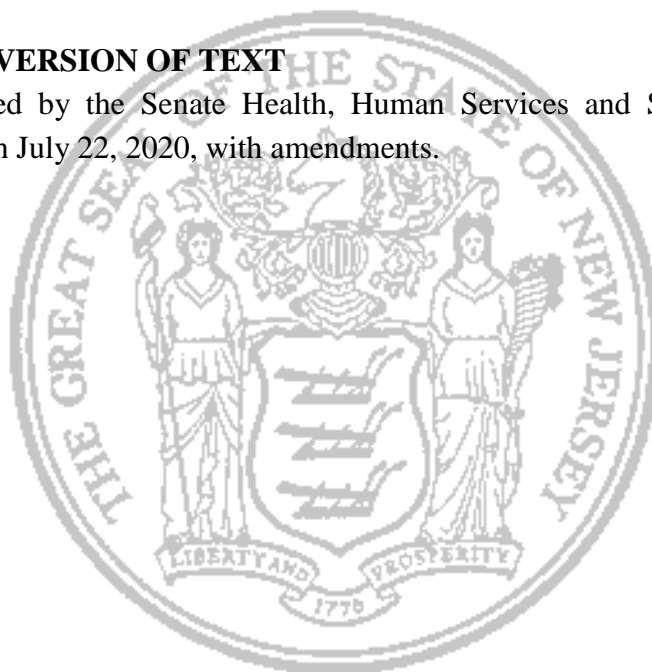

SYNOPSIS

Designates August 31 of each year “Overdose Awareness Day” in New Jersey.

CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT

As reported by the Senate Health, Human Services and Senior Citizens Committee on July 22, 2020, with amendments.

1 A **JOINT RESOLUTION** designating August 31 of each year as
2 “Overdose Awareness Day” in New Jersey.

4 **WHEREAS**, ¹**[Drug addiction]** Substance use disorder¹ is a chronic
5 disease ¹**[,]**¹ characterized by ¹the problematic,¹ compulsive ¹,¹ or
6 ¹**[difficult to control drug]** difficult-to-control¹ use ¹of drugs and
7 other substances,¹ despite harmful consequences; and

8 **WHEREAS**, ¹**[Drug addiction]** Substance use disorder, particularly
9 when it involves opioid drugs,¹ is seen by both the ¹federal¹
10 Centers for Disease Control ¹and Prevention¹ and the World Health
11 Organization as a fast-growing epidemic that can all too easily lead
12 to overdose and death; and

13 **WHEREAS**, In 2018, 67,367 individuals died from drug overdoses in
14 the United States; and

15 **WHEREAS**, In New Jersey alone, 2,900 people died from drug
16 overdoses in 2018; and

17 **WHEREAS**, Furthermore, for every drug overdose that results in death,
18 there are many more nonfatal overdoses, each taking an emotional
19 and economic toll on ¹**[the individual]** individuals¹ , their
20 ¹**[family]** families¹ , and the community at large; and

21 **WHEREAS**, ¹**[Drug addiction]** A substance use disorder¹ can fuel
22 feelings of shame, guilt, embarrassment, depression, and
23 hopelessness, causing individuals to resist seeking treatment and
24 support; and

25 **WHEREAS**, Overdose Awareness Day is a global event held on August
26 31 of each year that aims to raise awareness of drug overdoses,
27 reduce the stigma of a drug-related death, and ¹**[to]**¹ acknowledge
28 the grief felt by families and friends remembering those who
29 ¹**[have died or had a permanent injury]** died or were permanently
30 injured¹ as a result of a drug overdose; and

31 **WHEREAS**, To further the goals of Overdose Awareness Day, all flags
32 throughout the State should be flown at half-staff for the day’s
33 duration; and

34 **WHEREAS**, Recognizing Overdose Awareness Day in New Jersey
35 sends a strong message to former ¹**[or]** and¹ current substance
36 users, namely, that they are valued, and that overdose death is
37 preventable; now, therefore,

39 **BE IT RESOLVED** *by the Senate and General Assembly of the*
40 *State of New Jersey:*

42 1. August 31 of each year shall be designated as “Overdose
43 Awareness Day” in New Jersey to raise awareness of overdose and
44 reduce the stigma of a drug-related death.

- 1 2. The Governor is respectfully requested to order flags be
2 flown at half-staff 'on August 31 of each year' and to 'annually'
3 issue a proclamation calling upon public officials and the citizens of
4 this State to observe "Overdose Awareness Day" with appropriate
5 activities and programs **'[each year]'**
