1 AN ACT concerning <sup>2</sup>[public school curriculum and supplementing  
2 chapter 35 of Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes] the  
3 construction of destructive devices and amending <sup>3</sup>[N.J.S.2C:39-  
4 14<sup>2</sup>] P.L.1983, c.229<sup>3</sup>.

6 **BE IT ENACTED** *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*  
7 *of New Jersey:*

9 1. <sup>2</sup>[a. No teaching staff member shall use any visual aid or  
10 instruct any student on the methods used to make any <sup>1</sup>[explosives,  
11 including any bomb, shell or similar device filled with one or more  
12 explosives,] destructive device as defined in N.J.S.2C:39-1<sup>1</sup> or  
13 knowingly permit any student to view any visual aid or receive  
14 information on the methods used to make any <sup>1</sup>[explosives, including  
15 any bomb, shell or similar device filled with one or more explosives]  
16 destructive device<sup>1</sup>.

17 b. Any person who violates the provisions of this act shall be guilty  
18 of a crime of the fourth degree.]

19 <sup>3</sup>[N.J.S.2C:39-14] Section 1 of P.L.1983, c.229 (C.2C:39-14)<sup>3</sup> is  
20 amended to read as follows:

21 a. Any person who teaches or demonstrates to any other person the  
22 use, application, or making of any firearm, explosive or destructive  
23 device, or technique capable of causing injury or death to a person,  
24 knowing or having reason to know or intending that it will be  
25 employed for use in, or in furtherance of, an illegal activity is guilty of  
26 a crime of the second degree.

27 b. Any person who assembles with one or more persons for the  
28 purpose of training with, practicing with, or being instructed in the use  
29 of any firearm, explosive or destructive device, or technique capable  
30 of causing injury or death to a person, intending to unlawfully employ

1 it for use in, or in furtherance of, an illegal activity is guilty of a crime  
2 of the second degree.

3 c. <sup>3</sup>[Any person who teaches a student enrolled in a public or  
4 private elementary or secondary school how to construct a destructive  
5 device is guilty of a crime of the fourth degree] No teaching staff  
6 member, in the course of his professional duties, shall provide  
7 instruction on how to create a destructive device to a student enrolled  
8 in a public or private elementary or secondary school, for purposes  
9 other than as a part of the approved curriculum. Any person who  
10 violates this subsection is guilty of a crime of the fourth degree<sup>3</sup>. The  
11 provisions of this subsection shall not be construed to infringe on the  
12 rights of law enforcement officers in the performance of their duties.<sup>2</sup>
