1 AN ACT concerning child support enforcement and supplementing  
2 chapter 17 of Title 2A of the New Jersey Statutes.

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4 **BE IT ENACTED** *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*  
5 *of New Jersey:*

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7 1. As used in this section, "professional or occupational license"  
8 means any certificate, registration or license issued by a State  
9 department, board, commission or authority or by the New Jersey  
10 Supreme Court to practice a profession or occupation.

11 a. Every order of a court for child support payments shall include  
12 a written notice to the obligor that a professional or occupational  
13 license applied for or held by the obligor may be denied or suspended  
14 if the obligor has accumulated arrearages in an amount equal to the  
15 amount of support payable for 14 days.

16 b. The court or probation department having jurisdiction over the  
17 obligor who applies for or holds a professional or occupational license  
18 shall notify the appropriate professional board when the obligor has  
19 accumulated child support payment arrearages in an amount equal to  
20 the amount of support payable for 14 days.

21 c. The professional or occupational board which receives notice of  
22 an obligor's child support payment arrearages pursuant to subsection  
23 b. of this section, shall notify the obligor that his application for a  
24 professional or occupational license may be denied or his existing  
25 professional or occupational license may be suspended for nonpayment  
26 of child support. The denial or suspension shall be carried out in full  
27 compliance with all procedural due process requirements.

28 d. An application for a professional or occupational license which  
29 has been denied for failure to make child support payments shall be  
30 processed upon proof from the court or probation department having  
31 jurisdiction that the obligor is not in arrears for child support. A  
32 professional or occupational license which has been suspended for  
33 failure to make child support payments shall be reinstated upon proof  
34 from the court or probation department having jurisdiction that the  
35 obligor is not in arrears for child support.

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7 Provides for denial of application for, or suspension of, driver's license  
8 or professional license for nonpayment of child support.
