1 AN ACT concerning the acceptance by the State of New Jersey of  
2 parolees from other states and supplementing Title 2A of the New  
3 Jersey Statutes.

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5 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State  
6 of New Jersey:

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8 1. a. As used in this section:

9 (1) "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of the Department  
10 of Corrections.

11 (2) "Compact" means the compact for the supervision of parolees  
12 and probationers set forth in N.J.S.A.2A:168-14 et seq.

13 b. Whenever the commissioner as the compact administrator  
14 determines that a parolee from another state is eligible to reside in  
15 New Jersey pursuant to the provisions of the compact, a report  
16 indicating the ground for this determination shall be submitted to the  
17 Attorney General for review. The commissioner shall not grant  
18 permission for the transfer of that parole to New Jersey until the  
19 Attorney General has approved that report.

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21 2. This act shall take effect 30 days following enactment.

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STATEMENT

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26 Presently, whenever pursuant to the terms of the interstate compact  
27 on parolees, a parolee from another state requests permission to  
28 relocate to New Jersey, the Commissioner of the Department of  
29 Corrections has the responsibility of reviewing that request and  
30 determining whether the parolee is eligible to reside in New Jersey.  
31 This bill would provide that if the commissioner determines that a  
32 parolee from another state is eligible for transfer to New Jersey, a  
33 report indicating the grounds for this determination shall be submitted  
34 to the Attorney General for review. Permission for the transfer of that

1 parolee to New Jersey would not be granted until the report is  
2 approved by the Attorney General.

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7 Requires approval by Attorney General of transfers of parolees from  
8 other states to New Jersey.
