1 AN ACT appropriating ¹[\$2,484,364] \$2,235,928¹ from the
2 "Stormwater Management and Combined Sewer Overflow
3 Abatement Bond Act of 1989," P.L.1989, c.181, for the purpose of
4 providing grants to local government units for financing the cost of
5 the planning of combined sewer overflow abatement projects.

7 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
8 of New Jersey:

9

10 1. a. There is appropriated from the "Stormwater Management and
11 Combined Sewer Overflow Abatement Fund," created pursuant to
12 section 14 of the "Stormwater Management and Combined Sewer
13 Overflow Abatement Bond Act of 1989," P.L.1989, c.181, to the
14 Department of Environmental Protection the sum of ¹[\$2,484,364]
15 \$2,235,928¹ for the purpose of providing grants to local government
16 units for financing the cost of the planning of combined sewer
17 overflow abatement projects, as follows:

24 b. The Passaic Valley Sewerage Commissioners are authorized,
25 pursuant to the provisions of R.S.58:14-1 et seq., to collect, treat and
26 dispose of sewage for contracting municipalities located within the
27 Passaic Valley Sewerage District. The contracting municipalities
28 comprising the Passaic Valley Sewerage District are located in parts
29 of Bergen, Essex, Hudson, Passaic and Union counties, as follows:

30 (1) Bergen County: East Rutherford Boro, Elmwood Park Boro,
31 Fair Lawn Boro, Franklin Lakes Boro, Garfield City, Glen Rock Boro,

1 Hackensack City, Hasbrouck Heights Boro, Lodi Boro, Lyndhurst
2 Township, North Arlington Boro, Ridgewood Village, Rutherford
3 Boro, Saddle Brook Township, South Hackensack Township,
4 Wallington Boro and Wood-Ridge Boro.

5 (2) Essex County: Belleville Town, Bloomfield Town, Cedar
6 Grove Township, East Orange City, Glen Ridge Boro, Montclair
7 Town, Newark City, North Caldwell Boro, Nutley Town, Orange City,
8 South Orange Village and West Orange Town.

9 (3) Hudson County: Bayonne City, East Newark Boro, Harrison
10 Town, Jersey City, Kearny Town and Union City.

11 (4) Passaic County: Clifton City, Haledon Boro, Hawthorne Boro,
12 North Haledon Boro, Little Falls Township, Passaic City, Paterson
13 City, Prospect Park Boro, Totowa Boro and West Paterson Boro.

14 (5) Union County: Elizabeth City and Hillside Township.

15 c. Any transfer of any funds or project sponsor listed in subsection
16 a. of this section shall require the approval of the Joint Budget
17 Oversight Committee or its successor.

19 2. The Department of Environmental Protection may apply the
20 provisions of the "Sewage Infrastructure Improvement Act," P.L.1988,
21 c.90 (C.58:25-23 et seq.), and any rules or regulations adopted
22 pursuant thereto, as appropriate, in awarding the grants authorized
23 pursuant to section 1 of this act.

25 3. Subject to the approval of the Joint Budget Oversight
26 Committee or its successor, the Commissioner of Environmental
27 Protection may reduce the amount of any grant awarded pursuant to
28 section 1 of this act based upon final allowable project cost determined
29 in accordance with rules and regulations adopted pursuant to the
30 "Sewage Infrastructure Improvement Act," P.L.1988, c.90
31 (C.58:25-23 et seq.).

33 4. The expenditure of the sums appropriated by this act is subject
34 to the provisions and conditions of P.L.1989, c.181.

36 5. This act shall take effect immediately.
