1 AN ACT establishing an osteoporosis prevention and education
2 program in the Department of Health ¹and Senior Services¹ and
3 supplementing Title 26 of the Revised Statutes.
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5 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
6 of New Jersey:

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8 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Osteoporosis
9 Prevention and Education Program Act."
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11 2. As used in this act:

12 "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Health ¹and Senior
13 Services¹.

14 "Council" means the ¹[Osteoporosis Prevention and Education
15 Advisory] Interagency¹ Council ¹on Osteoporosis¹ established
16 pursuant to this act.

17 "Department" means the Department of Health ¹and Senior
18 Services¹.

19 "Program" means the osteoporosis prevention and education
20 program established pursuant to this act.

22 3. a. The Commissioner of Health ¹and Senior Services¹ shall
23 establish an osteoporosis prevention and education program in the
24 Department of Health ¹ and Senior Services¹. The purpose of the
25 program is to promote: public awareness of the causes of
26 osteoporosis; options for prevention; the value of early detection; and
27 possible treatments, including the benefits and risks of those
28 treatments. The department may accept, for that purpose, any special
29 grant of money, services, or property from the federal government or
30 any of its agencies, or from any foundation, organization, or medical
31 school.

1 b. The program shall include the following:

2 (1) Development of a public education and outreach campaign to
3 promote osteoporosis prevention and education, including, but not
4 limited to, the following subjects:

5 (a) The cause and nature of the disease;

6 (b) Risk factors;

7 (c) The role of hysterectomy;

8 (d) Prevention of osteoporosis, including nutrition, diet, and
9 physical exercise;

10 (e) Diagnostic procedures and appropriate indications for their use;

11 (f) Hormone replacement, including the benefits and risks;

12 (g) Environmental safety and injury prevention; and

13 (h) Availability of osteoporosis diagnostic treatment services in the
14 community.

15 (2) Development of educational materials to be made available for
16 consumers, particularly targeted to high-risk groups, through local
17 boards of health, physicians, other health care providers, including, but
18 not limited to, health maintenance organizations, hospitals, and clinics,
19 and women's organizations.

20 (3) Development of professional education programs for health
21 care providers to assist them in understanding research findings and
22 the subjects set forth in paragraph (1) of this subsection.

23 (4) Development and maintenance of a list of current providers of
24 specialized services for the prevention and treatment of osteoporosis.
25 Dissemination of the list shall be accompanied by a description of
26 diagnostic procedures, appropriate indications for their use, and a
27 cautionary statement about the current status of osteoporosis research,
28 prevention, and treatment. The statement shall also indicate that the
29 department does not license, certify, or in any other way approve
30 osteoporosis programs or centers in this State.

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32 4. There is established an ¹[Osteoporosis Prevention and Education
33 Advisory] Interagency¹ Council ¹on Osteoporosis¹ in the department
34 to advise the commissioner on the development and implementation of
35 the program. The members of the council shall be appointed by the
36 commissioner, and shall include the following: The Director of the
37 Division of Epidemiology, Environmental and Occupational Health
38 Services ¹and the Assistant Commissioner of Senior Affairs¹ in the
39 department and the ¹[Directors] Director¹ of the Division on Women
40 ¹and the Division on Aging¹ in the Department of Community
41 Affairs, as ex officio members, and public members who are
42 representatives of: persons with osteoporosis; women's health
43 organizations; public health educators; experts in bone and
44 osteoporosis research, prevention and treatment; and health care
45 providers, including at least one radiologist, orthopedist, registered
46 professional nurse, physical therapist and nutritionist. The members

1 of the council shall serve without compensation and shall not be
2 reimbursed for any expenses incurred by them in the performance of
3 their duties.

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5 5. The commissioner shall report to the Governor and the
6 Legislature no later than 18 months after the effective date of this act,
7 and annually thereafter, on the activities and accomplishments of the
8 program.

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10 6. The commissioner, pursuant to the "Administrative Procedure
11 Act," P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et seq.), shall adopt rules and
12 regulations to effectuate the purposes of this act.

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14 7. This act shall take effect immediately.
