The driver of a vehicle upon a highway shall yield the right of way to any authorized emergency vehicle when it is operated 9 10 on official business, or in the exercise of the driver's profession or calling, in response to an emergency call or in the pursuit of an actual 11 12 or suspected violator of the law and when an audible signal by bell, siren, exhaust whistle or other means is sounded from the authorized 13 emergency vehicle and when the authorized emergency vehicle, except 14 15 a police vehicle, is equipped with at least one lighted lamp displaying a red light visible under normal atmospheric conditions from a distance 16 17 of at least five hundred feet to the front of the vehicle. b. [This] <sup>1</sup>[Except as provided in N.J.S.59:5-2, this] This <sup>1</sup> section 18 19 shall not relieve the driver of any authorized emergency vehicle from 20 the duty to drive with due regard for the safety of all persons, nor shall it protect the driver from the consequences of his reckless disregard 21 for the safety of others. <sup>1</sup>Nothing in this section shall be construed to 22 23 limit any immunity or defense otherwise provided by law.<sup>1</sup> 24 (cf: P.L.1951, c.23, s.49) 25 2.
