1 AN ACT concerning ¹[public school curriculum and supplementing
2 chapter 35 of Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes] the
3 construction of destructive devices and amending P.L.1983, c.229¹.

6 **BE IT ENACTED** *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*
7 *of New Jersey:*

9 ¹[1. a. No teaching staff member shall use any visual aid or
10 instruct any student on the methods used to make any explosives,
11 including any bomb, shell or similar device filled with one or more
12 explosives, or knowingly permit any student to view any visual aid or
13 receive information on the methods used to make any explosives,
14 including any bomb, shell or similar device filled with one or more
15 explosives.

16 b. Any person who violates the provisions of this act shall be guilty
17 of a crime of the fourth degree.]¹

19 ¹1. Section 1 of P.L.1983, c.229 (C. 2C:39-14) is amended to read
20 as follows:

21 1. a. Any person who teaches or demonstrates to any other
22 person the use, application, or making of any firearm, explosive or
23 destructive device, or technique capable of causing injury or death to
24 a person, knowing or having reason to know or intending that it will
25 be employed for use in, or in furtherance of, an illegal activity is guilty
26 of a crime of the second degree.

27 b. Any person who assembles with one or more persons for the
28 purpose of training with, practicing with, or being instructed in the use
29 of any firearm, explosive or destructive device, or technique capable
30 of causing injury or death to a person, intending to unlawfully employ
31 it for use in, or in furtherance of, an illegal activity is guilty of a crime

2 c. Any person who teaches a student enrolled in a public or private
3 elementary or secondary school how to construct a destructive device
4 is guilty of a crime of the fourth degree. The provisions of this
5 subsection shall not be construed to infringe on the rights of law
6 enforcement officers in the performance of their duties.¹
