1 **AN ACT** concerning certain school buses and amending P.L.1983,
2 c.206.

4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
5 of New Jersey:

7 1. Section 1 of P.L.1983, c.206 (C.39:3B-5.1) is amended to read
8 as follows:

9 1. a. School buses, under the jurisdiction of the public schools and
10 manufactured prior to April 1, 1977, other than those of the transit
11 type whose gross vehicle weight (G.V.W.) exceeds 25,000 pounds,
12 shall not be used for pupil transportation purposes beyond the end of
13 the tenth year from the date of manufacture, as noted on the vehicle
14 registration, or at the end of the school year in which that date falls,
15 whichever is later. School buses manufactured on or after April 1,
16 1977, other than those of the transit type whose gross vehicle weight
17 (G.V.W.) exceeds 25,000 pounds, shall not be used for pupil
18 transportation purposes beyond the end of the twelfth year from the
19 date of manufacture, as noted on the vehicle registration, or at the end
20 of the school year in which that date falls, whichever is later.

21 b. Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection a. of this section,
22 a school district may use a school bus manufactured on or after
23 April 1, 1977, other than those of the transit type whose gross vehicle
24 weight (G.V.W.) exceeds 25,000 pounds, for pupil transportation
25 purposes beyond the end of the twelfth year from the date of its
26 manufacture, if that school bus passes the in-depth inspection the
27 Division of Motor Vehicles, pursuant to section 3 of P.L. 1983, c.206
28 (C.39:3B-5.3), is required to perform annually prior to the beginning
29 of the school year on school buses which have been used for more than
30 10 years for pupil transportation purposes.
