1 AN ACT concerning school district consolidation of services grants
2 and amending P.L.1996, c.138.

4 **BE IT ENACTED** *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*
5 *of New Jersey:*

7 1. Section 30 of P.L.1996, c.138 (C.18A:7F-30) is amended to
8 read as follows:

9 30. a. The Commissioner of Education shall establish a
10 Consolidation of Services Grant Program in the 1997-98 school year.
11 The goal of the grant program shall be to utilize the county special
12 services school districts and other districts to promote shared
13 services and regionalization of such services as transportation, child
14 study teams, related and other specialized services, programs of
15 professional development, legal and arbitration services, technology,
16 and purchasing.

17 A county special services school district or other district which
18 elects to participate in the grant program shall submit an application
19 to the Department of Education based upon a request for proposal
20 developed by the department [in consultation with the county special
21 services school districts]. [Three] Twelve grants in the amount of
22 \$50,000 per grant shall be awarded by the commissioner in the first
23 year of the program and an additional [two] eight grants in the second
24 year. [The total grants awarded by the department in the first year of
25 the program shall be in the amount of \$600,000.]

26 b. The commissioner may establish a five-year sending-receiving
27 school district tuition calculation pilot project for the Ocean Township
28 School District in Ocean County and the Barnegat School District in
29 Ocean County. The project shall provide a procedure whereby the
30 tuition charged by a receiving school district shall be established in
31 relationship to the maximum T&E budget.

34 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

3 This bill provides that school districts, in addition to county special
4 services school districts, may participate in the Consolidation of
5 Services Grant Program established under the "Comprehensive
6 Educational Improvement and Financing Act of 1996," P.L.1996,
7 c.138. The goal of that grant program is to promote shared services
8 and regionalization of services among school districts such as
9 transportation, child study teams, and other specialized services.

10 The bill provides that in the 1997-98 school year, twelve grants in
11 the amount of \$50,000 each will be awarded, and in the second year
12 eight grants will be awarded.
