1 AN ACT appropriating \$21,610,000 from the "Green Acres, Farmland and
2 Historic Preservation, and Blue Acres Bond Act of 1995," P.L.1995,
3 c.204, for the development of lands by the State for recreation and
4 conservation purposes.

6 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of
7 New Jersey:

8

9 1. a. There is appropriated to the Department of Environmental
10 Protection from the "1995 New Jersey Green Acres Fund," established
11 pursuant to section 22 of the "Green Acres, Farmland and Historic
12 Preservation, and Blue Acres Bond Act of 1995," P.L.1995, c.204, the
13 sum of \$21,610,000 for the development of lands by the State for
14 recreation and conservation purposes. This sum shall include
15 administrative costs and shall be allocated for various State park and
16 wildlife management area renovation, rehabilitation and development
17 projects as follows:

20 b. Any transfer of funds, change in project sponsor, or change in
21 project site or type listed in subsection a. of this section shall require the
22 approval of the Joint Budget Oversight Committee or its successor.

23 c. To the extent that moneys remain available after the projects listed
24 in subsection a. of this section are offered funding pursuant thereto, the
25 projects listed in P.L. , c. (C.) (now before the Legislature as
26 Senate Bill No. of 1997 or Assembly Bill No. 2897 of 1997) shall be
27 eligible for additional funding, including administrative costs, utilizing
28 those remaining moneys, in a sequence consistent with the priority system
29 established by the Department of Environmental Protection, and with the
30 approval of the Joint Budget Oversight Committee or its successor.

32 2. The expenditure of the sums appropriated by this act is subject to
33 the provisions and conditions of P.L.1995, c.204.

35 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

40 This bill would appropriate \$21,610,000 from the “1995 New Jersey
41 Green Acres Fund,” established pursuant to section 22 of the “Green Acres,
42 Farmland and Historic Preservation, and Blue Acres Bond Act of 1995,” P.L.
43 1995, c.204, for the development of state park and wildlife management area
44 lands by the State for recreation and conservation purposes. This sum would
45 include administrative costs.
