INTRODUCED JUNE 23, 1997

1 AN ACT establishing the New Jersey Commission on Women's Health  
2 and supplementing Title 26 of the Revised Statutes.

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4 **BE IT ENACTED** *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*  
5 *of New Jersey:*

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7 1. There is established the New Jersey Commission on Women's  
8 Health.

9 The commission shall consist of 19 members, including the  
10 Commissioners of Health, Human Services and Community Affairs,  
11 and the Directors of the Division on Aging and the Division of Women  
12 in the Department of Community Affairs, or their designees, who shall  
13 serve *ex officio*. The President of the Senate shall appoint two  
14 members of the Senate and the Speaker of the General Assembly shall  
15 appoint two members of the General Assembly, in each case no more  
16 than one of whom shall be of the same political party. The Governor  
17 shall appoint 10 public members who are residents of the State, five of  
18 whom shall be health care professionals, at least one of whom  
19 represents health care facilities and at least one of whom represents the  
20 health insurance industry; five of whom shall be consumers of women's  
21 health services. No less than seven of the public members shall be  
22 women.

23 The term of office of each public member shall be three years, but  
24 of the members first appointed, three shall be appointed for a term of  
25 one year, three shall be appointed for a term of two years and four  
26 shall be appointed for a term of three years. A public member shall  
27 hold office for the term of his appointment and until his successor has  
28 been appointed and qualified. A member of the Legislature shall serve  
29 during his term of office. All vacancies shall be filled for the balance  
30 of the unexpired term in the same manner as the original appointment.  
31 A member of the commission is eligible for reappointment.

32 The public members of the commission shall not receive any  
33 compensation for their services, but shall be reimbursed for the actual  
34 and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties as  
35 members of the commission, within the limits of funds available to the  
36 commission.

37 The members of the commission shall annually elect a chairman and

1 a vice-chairman from among the public members and may select a  
2 secretary, who need not be a member of the commission.

3 The Department of Health shall provide staff and assistance which  
4 the commission requires to carry out its work.

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6 2. The commission shall:

7 a. Serve as an information and resource center for women's health  
8 information and data;

9 b. Serve as an advocate for the adoption and implementation of  
10 effective measures to improve women's health;

11 c. Review the programs of the Departments of Health, Human  
12 Services and Community Affairs and any other department of State  
13 government, as appropriate, that concern women's health and make  
14 recommendations to the departments that will enable them to better  
15 coordinate and improve the effectiveness of their efforts; and

16 d. Review and make recommendations to the Governor and the  
17 Legislature on the needs, priorities, programs and policies relating to  
18 women's health in this State.

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20 3. The commission shall be entitled to call upon the services of any  
21 State, county or municipal department, board, commission or agency,  
22 as may be available to it for these purposes, and to incur such traveling  
23 and other miscellaneous expenses as it may deem necessary for the  
24 proper execution of its duties and as may be within the limit of funds  
25 appropriated or otherwise made available to it for these purposes.

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27 4. The commission shall report annually, by September 1 of each  
28 year, to the Legislature and the Governor on any recommendations for  
29 administrative or legislative action that it deems appropriate.

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31 5. This act shall take effect immediately.

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#### STATEMENT

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36 This bill establishes a 19-member New Jersey Commission on  
37 Women's Health. Members will include the Commissioners of Health,  
38 Human Services and Community Affairs, and the Directors of the
