1 **AN ACT** providing for payment by the Police and Firemen's Retirement 2 System of New Jersey of a survivor's pension in certain cases.

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

7 1. If a member of the Police and Firemen's Retirement System was 8 employed by a township having a population of at least 45,000 and not 9 greater than 50,000, according to the federal decennial census most recently preceding the effective date of this act, that is located in a 10 11 county of the first class having a population of at least 700,000 and 12 not greater than 800,000 according to that census, retired in 1971 with 13 at least 16 years of creditable service on a disability retirement 14 allowance, was legally separated from the member's first spouse for a 15 period of at least 25 years prior to divorce from that spouse, and 16 married the person to whom the member died espoused within 15 17 months of the date of that divorce, then notwithstanding the provisions 18 to the contrary of P.L.1944, c.255 (C.43:16A-1 et seq.) or any other 19 law concerning the minimum period of time that a surviving spouse is required to have been married to a member of the retirement system 20 21 prior to the member's death in order to qualify for a benefit under the 22 retirement system, upon application by the surviving spouse of the member to the board of trustees of the retirement system on or before 23 24 the 180th day following the effective date of this act, the board of 25 trustees is authorized and directed to pay to that surviving spouse the 26 pension prescribed under subsection a. of section 26 of P.L.1967, 27 c.250 (C.43:16A-12.1), beginning on the first day of the second calendar month following receipt of the application by the board and 28 29 for so long as the surviving spouse continues to be qualified therefor, 30 together with any adjustments to that retirement allowance, computed 31 from the first day of that second calendar month, for which the 32 surviving spouse would be eligible under that computation pursuant to 33 the provisions of the "Pension Adjustment Act", P.L.1958, c.143 34 (C.43:3B-1 et seq.).

3 This bill provides that, if a member of the Police and Firemen's 4 Retirement System (PFRS) was employed by a township having a population of at least 45,000 and not greater than 50,000, according 5 6 to the federal decennial census most recently preceding the effective 7 date of the legislation, that is located in a county of the first class 8 having a population of at least 700,000 and not greater than 800,000 9 according to that census, retired in 1971 with at least 16 years of 10 creditable service on a disability retirement allowance, was legally 11 separated from the member's first spouse for a period of at least 25 12 years prior to divorce from that spouse, and married the person to 13 whom the member died espoused within 15 months of the date of that divorce, then notwithstanding the provisions to the contrary of the 14 15 statute governing the PFRS or any other law concerning the minimum period of time that a surviving spouse is required to have been married 16 17 to a member of the retirement system prior to the member's death in order to qualify for a benefit under PFRS, upon application by the 18 19 surviving spouse of the member to the PFRS board of trustees within 20 180 days following the effective date of the legislation, the board of 21 trustees is authorized and directed to pay to that surviving spouse the 22 pension prescribed under subsection a. of section 26 of P.L.1967, 23 c.250 (C.43:16A-12.1), beginning on the first day of the second calendar month following receipt of the application by the board and 24 25 for so long as the surviving spouse continues to be qualified therefor, 26 together with any adjustments to that retirement allowance, computed 27 from the first day of that second calendar month, for which the 28 surviving spouse would be eligible under that computation pursuant to 29 the provisions of the "Pension Adjustment Act", P.L.1958, c.143 30 (C.43:3B-1 et seq.).
