1 AN ACT concerning additional members of boards of chosen  
2 freeholders, and amending P.L.1964, c.36.

4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State  
5 of New Jersey:

7 1. Section 2 of P.L.1964, c.36 (C.40:20-20a) is amended to read  
8 as follows:

9 2. In any county in which 2 additional members are to be elected  
10 to the board of chosen freeholders as required by [this amendatory and  
11 supplementary act] R.S.40:20-20, the terms of office of said additional  
12 members shall be 3 years, except that in any county in which the board  
13 of chosen freeholders consists of more than three members prior to the  
14 addition, of said additional members first to be elected, one shall be for  
15 a term of 2 years and one shall be for a term of 3 years and in any  
16 county in which the board of chosen freeholders consists of three  
17 members prior to the addition, of said additional members first to be  
18 elected, one shall be for a term of 1 year and one shall be for a term of  
19 2 years.

22 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

27 This bill would provide that, in any county in which two additional  
28 members are to be elected to a board of chosen freeholders which  
29 consists of three members, the terms of office shall be 3 years, except  
30 that for the initial term one members shall have a term of 1 year and  
31 one member shall have a term of 2 years. The terms of office of  
32 additional members to be elected to boards of chosen freeholders  
33 consisting of more than three members would remain unaffected by  
34 this bill.
