1	A SENATE RESOLUTION urging the Department of Transportation to establish
2	safeguards for protecting the privacy of personal information in the files of
3	the Division of Motor Vehicles.
4	
5	WHEREAS, The Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) in the Department of
6	Transportation is considering the sale of certain personal information in its
7	driver's license and motor vehicle registration files to direct mail marketers
8	and other commercial interests; and
9	WHEREAS, The inclusion of a new revenue item of \$11 million in the
10	Governor's FY 1997 recommended budget for the sale of the DMV data
11	base indicates that DMV has been given a "green light" to proceed with the
12	sale of this information; and
13	WHEREAS, Individuals who provide their names, addresses, dates of birth,
14	social security numbers and other personal information to a governmental
15	agency have every right to expect that this information will be used by the
16	agency solely for official purposes unless they specifically authorize some
17	other use of their personal information; and
18	WHEREAS, The sale of personal information to direct mail and telephone
19	marketers can only serve to increase the existing torrent of unsolicited
20	"junk mail" and telephone marketing calls that many persons find excessive
21	and repugnant; now, therefore,

**Be It Resolved** by the Senate of the State of New Jersey:

1. The Senate of the State of New Jersey calls upon the Commissioner of Transportation to direct DMV to protect the privacy of the State's motorists by establishing a procedure to provide for affirmative authorization by an individual before any personal information in his driver's license or vehicle registration file is sold or otherwise released to a third party. An exception may be made for information provided to governmental agencies for use in

1	fulfilling legitimate governmental and law enforcement purposes and for
2	information on vehicular accidents, driving violations and driver status

4	2. A duly authenticated copy of this resolution, signed by the President and
5	attested by the Secretary, shall be forwarded to the Commissioner of
6	Transportation.

9	STATEMENT

1	This Senate resolution calls upon the Commissioner of Transportation to
12	protect the privacy of the State's motorists by directing the Division of Motor
13	Vehicles (DMV) to establish a procedure for requiring a motorist's affirmative
14	authorization prior to the release of any personal information from his driver's
15	license or motor vehicle registration files. This resolution responds to reports
16	that DMV is planning to sell the information in its driver's license and vehicle
17	registration data base to direct mail and telephone marketers and the inclusion
18	of an \$11 million revenue from this sale in the recommended FY 1997
19	budget.
