SENATE RESOLUTION No. 28

STATE OF NEW JERSEY

INTRODUCED MARCH 14, 1996

1	A SENATE RESOLUTION encouraging the New Jersey Congressional
2	Delegation to support federal legislation providing for greater local
3	television coverage for the State of New Jersey.
4	
5	WHEREAS, The residents of New Jersey have a strong desire to receive
6	television coverage of local news and information of their immediate
7	community; and
8	WHEREAS, The small number of full power television stations allocated to the
9	State of New Jersey is inadequate to meet the television coverage needs
10	of the State; and
11	WHEREAS, There are five licensed Low Power Television (LPTV) stations on
12	the air, which cover local news and community information, and the
13	Federal Communications Commission (FCC) has authorized the
14	construction of 16 additional LPTV stations in the State of New Jersey;
15	and
16	WHEREAS, LPTV stations do not have the right, enjoyed by full power
17	stations, to be carried on the local cable systems within New Jersey
18	because of a provision in the Cable Television Consumer Protection and
19	Competition Act of 1992, which limits "Must Carry" to LPTV stations
20	outside the largest 160 Metropolitan Statistical Areas and communities of
21	license with populations less than 35,000; and
22	WHEREAS, The cable operators of New Jersey have been very reluctant to
23	carry LPTV stations unless legally compelled to do so, even when LPTV
24	stations are broadcasting local news and community information; and
25	WHEREAS, This provision in the federal law and the conduct of cable systems
26	severely hamper the ability of LPTV stations to provide local news and
27	community information desired by residents of New Jersey; and
28	WHEREAS, The FCC is planning the transition of television broadcasting from
29	analog to digital but has not provided for the same transition for LPTV
30	stations, and the FCC's failure to preserve LPTV service during and after
31	the transition to digital broadcasting threatens the future of the local news
32	and community information provided by those stations to the State of New
33	Jersey; and

1	WHEREAS, It is altogether fitting and proper for this House to urge the New
2	Jersey Congressional Delegation to introduce and support legislation to
3	grant "Must Carry" rights for LPTV stations within the State of New Jersey
4	when those stations broadcast local news and community information on
5	a regular basis and to ensure the preservation of LPTV service during and
6	after the transition from analog to digital television, as such legislation will
7	greatly benefit the citizens of the State of New Jersey; now, therefore,
8	
9	BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the State of New Jersey:
10	
11	1. The New Jersey Congressional Delegation is urged to introduce and
12	support legislation to grant "Must Carry" rights for Low Power Television
13	stations within the State of New Jersey when those stations broadcast local
14	news and community information on a regular basis and to ensure the
15	preservation of Low Power Television service during and after the transition
16	from analog to digital television.

18	2. Duly authenticated copies of this resolution, signed by the President of
19	the Senate and attested by the Secretary thereof, shall be transmitted to each
20	member of Congress elected thereto from this State.

23	STATEMENT
24	
25	This Senate Resolution urges the New Jersey Congressional Delegation to
26	introduce and support legislation to grant "Must Carry" rights for Low Power
27	Television (LPTV) stations within the State of New Jersey when those stations
28	broadcast local news and community information on a regular basis and to
29	ensure the preservation of LPTV service during and after the transition from
30	analog to digital television.
31	LPTV stations provide television coverage of local news and community
32	information. There are five licensed LPTV stations on the air in New Jersey
33	and the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) has authorized the
34	construction of 16 additional stations. However, LPTV stations do not enjoy
35	the same right as full power stations to be carried on local cable systems under
36	the Cable Television Consumer Protection and Competition Act of 1992.
37	Further, while the FCC is planning the transition from analog to digital
38	television broadcasting, it has not made transitional arrangements for LPTV
39	stations. As such, it is vital that legislation granting "Must Carry" rights for
40	LPTV stations and ensuring the preservation of Low Power Television after
41	the transition to digital broadcasting be passed.
