- **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

The Commissioner of Labor and Workforce Development, in 10 consultation with the New Jersey Commission on Science, Innovation and Technology, shall conduct a study on the impact of artificial 11 intelligence-powered technology and automation on <sup>1</sup>[economic] the<sup>1</sup> 12 growth <sup>1</sup><u>of the State's economy</u><sup>1</sup> and shall prepare and submit a written 13 report, within one year of the effective date of this act, to the Governor 14 15 and, pursuant to section 2 of P.L.1991, c.164 (C.52:14-19.1), to the Legislature, the chairperson of the Assembly Science, Innovation <sup>1</sup>[,]<sup>1</sup> 16 and Technology Committee and the chairperson of the Senate 17 Economic Growth Committee, or their successor committees, which 18 19 shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

a. the predicted impact of artificial intelligence on the labor
market for highly-skilled and highly-educated professionals, such as
doctors, lawyers, data analysts, and similarly skilled workers;

b. the occupations or industries most impacted by an expansion ofthe use of artificial intelligence;

c. the implications of these findings on the long-term plans foreducating the next generation of highly-skilled employees;

d. new professions that may come into existence as a result of theexpansion of the use of artificial intelligence and automation; and

e. the impact of artificial intelligence on labor productivity and
