AN ACT concerning the definition of veteran for civil service hiring
 preference and amending N.J.S.11A:5-1.

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

1. N.J.S.11A:5-1 is amended to read as follows

11A:5-1. As used in this chapter:

a. "Disabled veteran" means any veteran who is eligible to be 9 compensated for a service-connected disability from war service by 10 the United States Veterans Administration or who receives or is 11 12 entitled to receive equivalent compensation for a service-connected 13 disability which arises out of military or naval service as set forth in 14 this chapter and who has submitted sufficient evidence of the record 15 of disability incurred in the line of duty to the Adjutant General of the Department of Military and Veterans' Affairs and received a 16 17 determination of status no later than eight days prior to the issuance 18 of an employment list, for which that individual received a passing 19 score on an examination;

20 b. "Veteran" means any honorably discharged soldier, sailor, marine or nurse who served in any army or navy of the allies of the 21 22 United States in World War I, between July 14, 1914 and November 23 11, 1918, or who served in any army or navy of the allies of the 24 United States in World War II, between September 1, 1939 and 25 September 2, 1945 and who was inducted into that service through 26 voluntary enlistment, and was a citizen of the United States at the 27 time of the enlistment, and who did not renounce or lose his or her 28 United States citizenship; or any soldier, sailor, marine, airman, 29 nurse or army field clerk, who has served in the active military or 30 naval service of the United States and who has been discharged or 31 released under other than dishonorable conditions from that service 32 in any of the following wars or conflicts, and who has presented to the Adjutant General of the Department of Military and Veterans' 33 34 Affairs sufficient evidence of the record of service and received a 35 determination of status no later than eight days prior to the issuance 36 of an employment list, for which that individual received a passing 37 score on an examination:

38 (1) World War I, between April 6, 1917 and November 11,39 1918;

40 (2) World War II, on or after September 16, 1940, who shall
41 have served [at least 90 days] beginning on or before December 31,
42 1946 in [such] active service[, exclusive of any period of
43 assignment for a course of education or training under the Army
44 Specialized Training Program or the Navy College Training
45 Program, which course was a continuation of a civilian course and

5 (3) Korean conflict, on or after June 23, 1950, who shall have 6 served [at least 90 days] beginning on or before January 31, 1955, 7 in active service [, exclusive of any period of assignment for a course of education or training under the Army Specialized 8 9 Training Program or the Navy College Training Program, which 10 course was a continuation of a civilian course and was pursued to 11 completion, or as a cadet or midshipman at one of the service 12 academies; except that any person receiving an actual service-13 incurred injury or disability shall be classed as a veteran, whether or 14 not that person has completed the 90-day service];

15 (4) Lebanon crisis, on or after July 1, 1958, who has served in 16 Lebanon or on board any ship [actively engaged] in [patrolling] 17 the territorial waters of that nation [for a period, continuous or in the aggregate, of at least 14 days] commencing on or before 18 19 November 1, 1958 or the date of termination of that conflict, as 20 proclaimed by the President of the United States or Congress, 21 whichever date of termination is the latest, in such active 22 service[; provided, that any person receiving an actual service-23 incurred injury or disability shall be classed as a veteran whether or 24 not that person has completed the 14 days' service as herein 25 provided];

(5) Vietnam conflict, on or after December 31, 1960, who shall 26 27 have served at least 90 days] beginning on or before May 7, 1975, 28 in active service [, exclusive of any period of assignment for a 29 course of education or training under the Army Specialized 30 Training Program or the Navy College Training Program, which course was a continuation of a civilian course and was pursued to 31 32 completion, or as a cadet or midshipman at one of the service 33 academies, and exclusive of any service performed pursuant to the 34 provisions of section 511(d) of Title 10, United States Code, or 35 exclusive of any service performed pursuant to enlistment in the National Guard or the Army Reserve, Naval Reserve, Air Force 36 37 Reserve, Marine Corps Reserve, or Coast Guard Reserve; except 38 that any person receiving an actual service-incurred injury or 39 disability shall be classed as a veteran, whether or not that person 40 has completed the 90-day service as provided];

(6) Lebanon peacekeeping mission, on or after September 26,
1982, who has served in Lebanon or in another area in the region, or
on board any ship [actively engaged] in [patrolling] the territorial
waters of that nation [for a period, continuous or in the aggregate,
of at least 14 days] commencing on or before December 1, 1987 or
the date of termination of that mission, as proclaimed by the

President of the United States or Congress, whichever date of
 termination is the latest, in such active service [; provided, that any
 person receiving an actual service-incurred injury or disability shall
 be classed as a veteran whether or not that person has completed the
 14 days' service as herein provided];

(7) Grenada peacekeeping mission, on or after October 23, 6 7 1983, who has served in Grenada or in another area in the region, or 8 on board any ship [actively engaged] in [patrolling] the territorial waters of that nation [for a period, continuous or in the aggregate, 9 of at least 14 days] commencing on or before November 21, 1983 10 11 or the date of termination of that mission, as proclaimed by the President of the United States or Congress, whichever date of 12 13 termination is the latest, in such active service **[**; provided, that any 14 person receiving an actual service-incurred injury or disability shall 15 be classed as a veteran whether or not that person has completed the 14 days' service as herein provided]; 16

17 (8) Panama peacekeeping mission, on or after December 20, 1989 or the date of inception of that mission, as proclaimed by the 18 19 President of the United States or Congress, whichever date of 20 inception is earliest, who has served in Panama or in another area in 21 the region, or on board any ship [actively engaged] in [patrolling] 22 the territorial waters of that nation [for a period, continuous or in 23 the aggregate, of at least 14 days] commencing on or before 24 January 31, 1990 or the date of termination of that mission, as 25 proclaimed by the President of the United States or Congress, 26 whichever date of termination is the latest, in such active 27 service[; provided, that any person receiving an actual serviceincurred injury or disability shall be classed as a veteran whether or 28 29 not that person has completed the 14 days' service as herein 30 provided];

(9) Operation "Desert Shield/Desert Storm" mission in the 31 32 Arabian peninsula and the Persian Gulf, on or after August 2, 1990 33 or the date of inception of that operation, as proclaimed by the President of the United States or Congress, whichever date of 34 35 inception is earliest, who has served in the Arabian peninsula or on board any ship [actively engaged] in [patrolling] the Persian Gulf 36 [for a period, continuous or in the aggregate, of at least 14 days] 37 38 commencing on or before the date of termination of that mission, as 39 proclaimed by the President of the United States or Congress, 40 whichever date of termination is the latest, in such active 41 service[; provided, that any person receiving an actual serviceincurred injury or disability shall be classed as a veteran whether or 42 43 not that person has completed the 14 days' service as herein 44 provided];

45 (10) Operation Northern Watch and Operation Southern Watch,46 on or after August 27, 1992, or the date of inception of that

operation, as proclaimed by the President of the United States, 1 2 Congress or United States Secretary of Defense, whichever date of 3 inception is earliest, who served in the theater of operation, 4 including in the Arabian peninsula and the Persian Gulf, and in 5 [direct] support of that operation [for a period, continuously or in 6 the aggregate, of at least 14 days] in such active service 7 commencing on or before the date of termination of that operation, 8 as proclaimed by the President of the United States, Congress or 9 United States Secretary of Defense, whichever date of termination 10 is the latest ; provided, that any person receiving an actual service-11 incurred injury or disability while engaged in such service shall be 12 classed as a veteran whether or not that person has completed the 14 13 days' service as herein provided];

14 (11) Operation "Restore Hope" in Somalia, on or after 15 December 5, 1992, or the date of inception of that operation as 16 proclaimed by the President of the United States or the Congress, 17 whichever date is earliest, who has served in Somalia or in another 18 area in the region, or on board any ship [actively engaged] in 19 [patrolling] the territorial waters of that nation [for a period, 20 continuously or in the aggregate, of at least 14 days] in such active 21 service commencing on or before March 31, 1994[; provided that 22 any person receiving an actual service-incurred injury or disability 23 shall be classed as a veteran whether or not that person has 24 completed the 14-day service as herein provided];

25 (12) Operations "Joint Endeavor" and "Joint Guard" in the 26 Republic of Bosnia and Herzegovina, on or after November 20, 27 1995, who served in such active service in [direct] support of one 28 or both of the operations [for at least 14 days, continuously or in 29 the aggregate,] commencing on or before June 20, 1998, and (1) 30 was deployed in that nation or in another area in the region, or (2) 31 was on board a United States naval vessel operating in the Adriatic 32 Sea, or (3) operated in airspace above the Republic of Bosnia and 33 Herzegovina[; provided that any person receiving an actual service-34 incurred injury or disability shall be classed as a veteran whether or 35 not that person completed the 14-day service requirement];

36 (13) Operation "Uphold Democracy" in Haiti, on or after 37 September 19, 1994, who served in Haiti or on board any ship 38 [actively engaged] in [patrolling] the territorial waters of that 39 nation [for a period, continuously or in the aggregate, of at least 14 40 days] in such active service commencing on or before March 31, 41 1995, and who received an Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal for 42 such service ; provided, that any person receiving an actual service-43 incurred injury or disability shall be classed as a veteran whether or 44 not that person has completed the 14 days' service as herein 45 provided or received an Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal];

(14) Operation "Enduring Freedom", on or after September 11, 1 2 2001, who served in a theater of operation and in [direct] support 3 of that operation [for a period, continuously or in the aggregate, of at least 14 days] in such active service commencing on or before 4 5 the date the President of the United States or the United States 6 Secretary of Defense designates as the termination date of that operation[; provided, that any person receiving an actual service-7 8 incurred injury or disability while engaged in such service shall be 9 classed as a veteran whether or not that person has completed the 14 days' service as herein provided]; and 10 (15) Operation "Iraqi Freedom", on or after the date the 11

President of the United States or the United States Secretary of 12 Defense designates as the inception date of that operation, who 13 14 served in Iraq or in another area in the region in [direct] support of that operation [for a period, continuously or in the aggregate, of at 15 16 least 14 days] in such active service commencing on or before the 17 date the President of the United States or the United States Secretary of Defense designates as the termination date of that 18 19 operation[; provided, that any person receiving an actual service-20 incurred injury or disability while engaged in such service shall be 21 classed as a veteran whether or not that person has completed the 14 22 days' service as herein provided];

c. "War service" means service by a veteran in any war orconflict described in this chapter during the periods specified.

STATEMENT

Under current law, a veteran is eligible for a civil service hiring
preference, if the person served during specified dates or in
specified locations, and in some instances, for a specific length of
time.

This bill changes the definition of veteran for the civil service hiring preference by removing the requirement of service for specific lengths of time and broadens the specified locations for eligibility.
