#### SYNOPSIS

Requires discrimination prevention training for certain providers of services to senior citizens.

### CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT

As reported by the Assembly Aging and Senior Services Committee on December 7, 2020, with amendments.

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AN ACT concerning discrimination prevention training and services
 for seniors and supplementing Title 30 of the Revised Statutes.

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**BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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7 1. a. No later than nine months after the effective date of 8 P.L. , c. (C. ) (pending before the Legislature as this bill), the Commissioner of Human Services or the commissioner's 9 designee<sup>1</sup>[,]<sup>1</sup> shall develop a training program <sup>1</sup>that is<sup>1</sup> designed to 10 prevent and eliminate discrimination on the basis of sexual 11 12 orientation, gender identity, or gender expression in the delivery of 13 <sup>1</sup>[certain]<sup>1</sup> services to lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, 14 questioning, and intersex senior citizens in the State. The training 15 program shall also be designed to increase awareness among, and provide cultural competency to, service providers <sup>1</sup>[about] and 16 <u>their staff regarding</u><sup>1</sup> the issues  $^{1}$ <u>that are</u><sup>1</sup> encountered by lesbian, 17 18 gay, bisexual, transgender, questioning, and intersex seniors in order to  $^{1}\underline{both}^{1}$  ensure equal access to services  $^{1}\mathbf{I}, \mathbf{J}^{1}$  and improve the 19 delivery of those services to senior citizens and their caregivers. 20

b. <sup>1</sup>[The] <u>In developing the anti-discrimination training</u> <u>program pursuant to this section, the</u><sup>1</sup> commissioner<sup>1</sup>[,]<sup>1</sup> or the commissioner's designee<sup>1</sup>[,]<sup>1</sup> may consult <sup>1</sup><u>with</u><sup>1</sup> any agencies, advocacy organizations, or governmental entities as <sup>1</sup>[are determined] <u>may be deemed thereby</u><sup>1</sup> to be appropriate <sup>1</sup>[in developing the training program]<sup>1</sup>.

c. <sup>1</sup>[The commissioner shall ensure that a] (1) Each licensed 27 or certified<sup>1</sup> provider of services or supports to senior citizens 28 29 <sup>1</sup>[that] <u>in the State, who</u><sup>1</sup> contracts with, provides services through programs administered by, or receives funding from, the 30 Department of Human Services, any <sup>1</sup> of its divisions <u>division of</u> 31 the department<sup>1</sup>, or any area agency on aging <sup>1</sup>[completes], shall 32 <u>complete</u><sup>1</sup> the <sup>1</sup><u>anti-discrimination</u><sup>1</sup> training program <sup>1</sup>[no later 33 than] within<sup>1</sup> six months <sup>1</sup>[following the availability of the 34 program. Thereafter, each new service provider shall complete the 35 training within <u>after it is made available pursuant to this section or</u> 36 37 within<sup>1</sup> one month  ${}^{1}$  [of] <u>after<sup>1</sup></u> commencing the delivery of services 38 or supports <sup>1</sup>to senior citizens in the State, whichever is later.

39 (2) Each service provider who is required to undergo training
40 pursuant to paragraph (1) of this subsection shall also ensure that
41 each staff member employed thereby completes the anti42 discrimination training program developed pursuant to this section,
43 either within six months after the program is made available or

d. The department may make the training program available
online, by webinar, or by other means. The department shall
establish a protocol to ensure <sup>1</sup>[compliance by] <u>that service</u><sup>1</sup>
providers <sup>1</sup>[of services] <u>comply</u><sup>1</sup> with the requirements of
<sup>1</sup><u>subsection c. of</u><sup>1</sup> this section.

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- 2. This act shall take effect immediately upon enactment.
