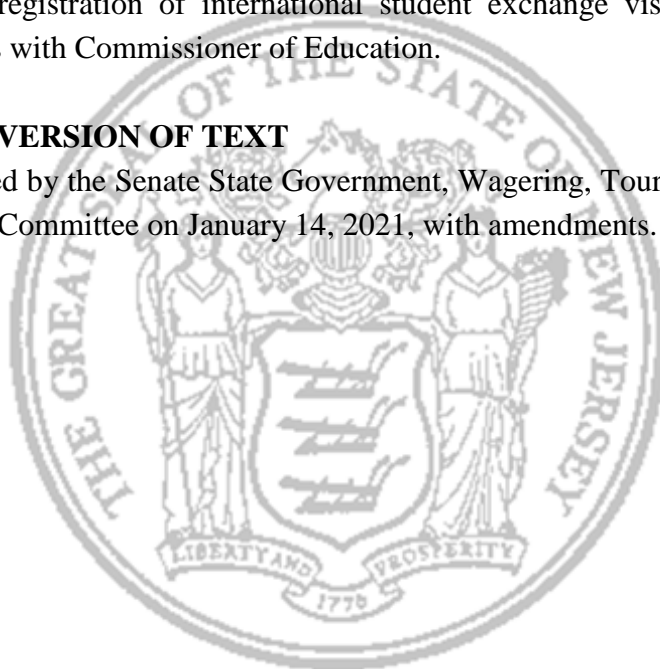

SYNOPSIS

Requires registration of international student exchange visitor placement organizations with Commissioner of Education.

CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT

As reported by the Senate State Government, Wagering, Tourism & Historic Preservation Committee on January 14, 2021, with amendments.

1 AN ACT concerning the placement of international students in
2 public schools and supplementing Title ¹**[52]** 18A¹ of the
3 Revised Statutes.

5 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
6 of New Jersey:

8 1. As used in P.L. , c. (C.) (pending before the
9 Legislature as this bill):

10 ¹“Commissioner” means the Commissioner of the New Jersey
11 Department of Education.¹

12 “International student exchange visitor” or “student” means a
13 person 18 years of age or under, or up to age 21 if enrolled or to be
14 enrolled in high school in this State, placed by an international
15 student exchange visitor placement organization, who enters the
16 United States with a nonimmigrant visa.

17 “International student exchange visitor placement organization”
18 or “organization” means a person, partnership, corporation, school,
19 or other entity that regularly arranges the placement of international
20 student exchange visitors for the purpose, in whole or in part, of
21 allowing the student an opportunity to attend school in the United
22 States.

23 ¹**[“Secretary” means the Secretary of State of New Jersey.]**¹

25 2. a. An international student exchange visitor placement
26 organization that places students in public schools in the State shall
27 register with the ¹**[Secretary of State]** Commissioner of Education¹.
28 To be eligible for registration, an international student exchange
29 visitor placement organization shall:

30 (1) be in compliance with United States Department of State
31 regulations on exchange visitor programs at 22 C.F.R. s.62.1
32 through 62.17, and at 22 C.F.R. 62.25, or be certified by the
33 Council of Standards for International Educational Travel and be
34 listed on the council’s Advisory List of International Educational
35 Travel and Exchange Programs; and

36 (2) present to the ¹**[secretary]** commissioner¹ current credentials
37 from the United States Department of State or the Council of
38 Standards for International Educational Travel that attest to such
39 compliance.

40 b. Registration with the ¹**[secretary]** commissioner¹ shall not be
41 considered or represented as an endorsement of the organization by
42 the ¹**[secretary]** commissioner¹ or by the State. Information
43 provided to the ¹**[secretary]** commissioner¹ pursuant to P.L. ,
44 c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature as this bill) is a public
45 record.

- 1 c. The ¹['Secretary shall annually provide to the Commissioner
2 of Education'] commissioner shall annually create¹ a list of all
3 registered international student exchange visitor placement
4 organizations. The commissioner shall annually distribute the list to
5 all school districts.
- 6 d. A person who fails to register as required pursuant to P.L. ,
7 c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature as this bill) is guilty of
8 a misdemeanor.

- 10 3. The ¹['Secretary of State'] Commissioner of Education¹ shall
11 adopt rules and regulations pursuant to the "Administrative
12 Procedures Act," P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et seq.), necessary to
13 implement the provisions of P.L. , c. (C.) (pending before
14 the Legislature as this bill).

- 16 4. This act shall take effect 180 days following the date of
17 enactment except that the ¹['Secretary of State'] Commissioner of
18 Education¹ may immediately take such anticipatory action as may
19 be required to implement the provisions of this act.
