#### **SYNOPSIS**

Requires State Treasurer to submit report to Legislature every six months identifying deadlines for applications for federal funds by State agencies.

#### **CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT**

1	AN ACT <sup>1</sup> [concerning deadlines for applications by State agencies
2	for federal funds ] establishing a Grants Management Office 1 and
3	supplementing Title 52 of the Revised Statutes.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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- 1. <sup>1</sup>[The State Treasurer] <u>a. There is established in the</u> 9 Department of the Treasury a Grants Management Office to improve efficiency, streamline processes, reduce administrative 10 11 burdens on both granting agencies and grant recipients, and facilitiate development and implementation of a Statewide 12 13 centralized grants management and accountability system.
  - b. The office shall be under the immediate supervision of a director, who shall report to the State Treasurer and who shall be a person qualified by training and experience to direct the work of such office. The director shall administer the work of the office and shall perform such other functions of the office as necessary to implement the provisions of P.L. . c. (C. ) (pending before the Legislature as this bill).
    - c. The Director of the Grants Management Office shall:
  - (1) distribute federal grant notices, coordinate applications, and provide information on the grant process to departments;
  - (2) distribute weekly information produced by the Federal Funds Information for States of grant opportunities to departments;
  - (3) coordinate with liaisons designated by each department to determine department interest in grant opportunities;
- 28 (4) create and maintain a database of active grants from 29 announcement and application through award, execution, and 30 compliance;
- (5) investigate whether applications for federal funds were 31 32 submitted appropriately and in accordance with relevant deadlines, 33 laws, rules and regulations and policies;
  - (6) act as a compliance officer to monitor and audit grants;
- 35 (7) conduct outreach to municipal, county, non-profit, and other 36 interested stakeholders concerning State and federal grants 37 opportunities;
- 38 (8) create and distribute training tools, standard operating 39 procedures, and best practices guidelines; and
- 40 (9) produce seminars and events, including annual conferences 41 for stateholders.
- 42 d. The Director of the Grants Management Office is authorized 43 to call upon any Executive Branch department or agency, including

staff in the Governor's Office, to supply the Grants Management 1 Office with information or other assistance as the director 2 3 determines necessary. Each Executive Branch department and 4 agency is hereby required, to the extent not inconsistent with law, to 5 cooperate fully with the director within the limits of each 6 department's or agency's statutory authority, and to furnish such 7 assistance on as timely a basis as is necessary to accomplish the 8 purpose of this law. e. The Director of the Grants Management Office 1 shall submit 9 10 to the Legislature, pursuant to section 2 of P.L.1991, c.164 (C.52:14-19.1), <sup>1</sup>[at intervals of six months,] annually <sup>1</sup> a report 11 12 <sup>1</sup>[identifying the deadlines, occurring in the six] that describes all federal funds received by State agencies in the preceding fiscal 13 14 year. I months immediately following the date of the report, for 15 applications by State agencies within, or in but not of, the Executive Branch of State government for federal funds from or for any 16 17 program, project, or purpose. The first report shall be submitted 18 within 30 days following the effective date of this act, 19 P.L. , c. (pending before the Legislature as this bill). 20 Each report shall: 21 describe in reasonable detail the program, project, or purpose; 22 identify the federal law or regulation pursuant to which the 23 program, project, or purpose was created and the funds have been 24 made available; 25 provide the address for the federal website that provides 26 information on the program, project, or purpose and the available 27 funds; 28 provide the name and address of the federal office or official to 29 which or to whom the application for funds is to be submitted; 30 explain in reasonable detail why a deadline has not or will not be 31 met and whether an extension has or will be granted; 32 summarize the history of the receipt of such funds for such 33 programs, projects, or purposes by the State within the past 10 34 years; 35 provide a list of reports prepared on the use of such funds in the 36 past and the location of those reports; and 37 provide such other information as the President of the Senate or
