## SYNOPSIS

Establishes study commission to examine development of mutually beneficial relationships between institutions of higher education and municipalities.

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1 AN ACT establishing a commission to study beneficial relationships 2 between institutions of higher education and municipalities. 3 4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 5 of New Jersey: 6 7 There is established a study commission for the purpose 1. a. 8 of examining the development of mutually beneficial relationships 9 between institutions of higher education and the municipalities in 10 which the institutions are located. The commission shall consist of 11 15 members as follows: 12 (1) the Secretary of Higher Education, or a designee; (2) ten members appointed by the Governor, including a 13 14 representative of the State colleges and universities established 15 pursuant to chapter 64 of Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes, a 16 representative of the public research universities, a representative of 17 the county colleges, a representative of the independent colleges and universities, a mayor or designee of a municipality in which a 18 19 State college or university is located, a mayor or designee of a 20 municipality in which a public research university is located, a mayor or designee of a municipality in which a county college is 21 located, a mayor or designee of a municipality in which an 22 23 independent college or university is located, a representative of the 24 New Jersey State League of Municipalities, and a representative of 25 the New Jersey Education Association; and 26 (3) four members of the public with demonstrated expertise or 27 interest in issues related to the work of the commission. The President of the Senate, the Speaker of the General Assembly, the 28 29 Minority Leader of the Senate, and the Minority Leader of the 30 General Assembly shall each appoint one of the public members. 31 Appointments to the commission shall be made within 30 b. 32 days of the effective date of this act. Vacancies in the membership 33 of the commission shall be filled in the same manner as the original 34 appointments were made. 35 Members of the commission shall without c. serve compensation but shall be reimbursed for necessary expenses 36 37 incurred in the performance of their duties within the limits of funds made available to the commission for its purposes. 38 39 40 2. a. The commission shall organize as soon as practicable, 41 but no later than 30 days following the appointment of its members. The commission shall choose a chairperson from among its 42 43 members and shall appoint a secretary who need not be a member 44 of the commission. 45 b. The Office of the Secretary of Higher Education shall 46 provide such professional staff and related support services as the 47 commission requires to carry out its work. The commission also shall be entitled to call to its assistance and avail itself of the 48

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services of the employees of any State, county, or municipal
 department, board, bureau, commission, or agency as it may require
 and as may be available to it for its purposes.

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5 3. It shall be the duty of the study commission to examine the 6 creation and implementation of mutually beneficial relationships 7 between the State's institutions of higher education and the 8 municipalities in which the institutions are located. The 9 commission shall study and consider issues including, but not 10 limited to, the following:

a. ways in which institutions of higher education and
municipalities may work closely together to foster relationships that
will benefit the institution, the institution's students, and the
community;

b. ways to increase the engagement of institutions of higher
education with their surrounding communities in order to address
and respond to community needs;

c. specific types of structured partnerships that may mutually
benefit institutions of higher education and their surrounding
communities including, but not limited to, partnerships related to
academic programs, research, student internship and work
opportunities, and community service and outreach;

d. the process by which an institution of higher education may
acquire additional land, including whether the municipality should
be required to approve the procurement of new land; and

26 e. recommendations or best practices for institutions of higher 27 education and municipalities regarding the creation and implementation of mutually beneficial 28 relationships and 29 partnerships.

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4. The commission shall issue a report of its findings and
recommendations to the Governor, and to the Legislature pursuant
to section 2 of P.L.1991, c.164 (C.52:14-19.1), no later than 12
months after the commission organizes.

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36 5. This act shall take effect immediately, and the commission37 shall expire 30 days after the submission of its report.

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STATEMENT

This bill establishes a study commission that will examine the creation and implementation of mutually beneficial relationships between the State's institutions of higher education and the municipalities in which the institutions are located. The commission will include the following 15 members: the Secretary of Higher Education; ten members appointed by the Governor, including a representative of the State colleges and universities, a 4

1 representative of the public research universities, a representative of 2 the county colleges, a representative of the independent colleges 3 and universities, a mayor of a municipality in which a State college 4 or university is located, a mayor of a municipality in which a public 5 research university is located, a mayor of a municipality in which a 6 county college is located, a mayor of a municipality in which an 7 independent college or university is located, a representative of the 8 New Jersey State League of Municipalities, and a representative of 9 the New Jersey Education Association; and four public members 10 with demonstrated expertise or interest in issues related to the work 11 of the commission.

12 Under the bill, the commission will study and consider the 13 following issues: (a) ways in which institutions of higher education 14 and municipalities may work closely together to foster relationships 15 that will benefit the institution, the institution's students, and the 16 community; (b) ways to increase the engagement of institutions of 17 higher education with their surrounding communities in order to 18 address and respond to community needs; (c) specific types of 19 structured partnerships that may mutually benefit institutions of 20 higher education and their surrounding communities including, but 21 not limited to, partnerships related to academic programs, research, 22 student internship and work opportunities, and community service 23 and outreach; (d) the process by which an institution of higher 24 education may acquire additional land, including whether the 25 municipality should be required to approve the procurement of new 26 land; and (e) recommendations or best practices for institutions of 27 higher education and municipalities regarding the creation and 28 implementation of mutually beneficial relationships and 29 partnerships.

The bill directs the study commission to issue a report of its findings and recommendations to the Governor and the Legislature no later than 12 months after the commission organizes.
