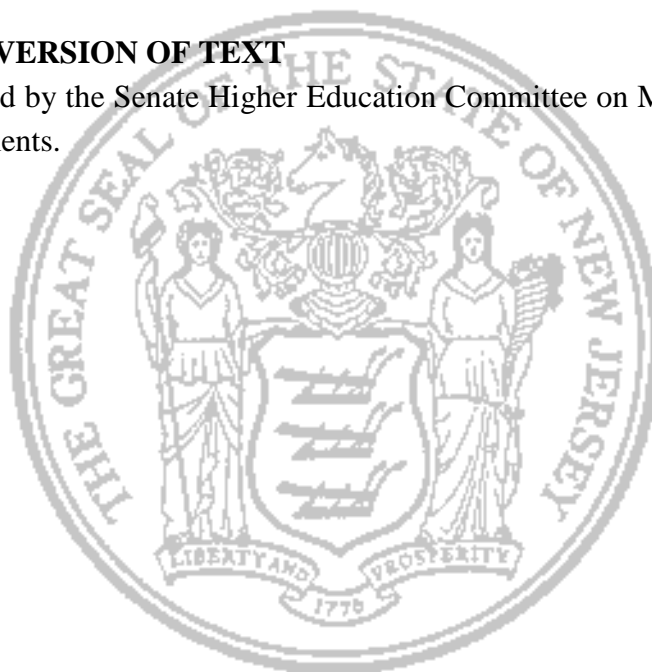

SYNOPSIS

Establishes study commission to examine development of mutually beneficial relationships between institutions of higher education and municipalities.

CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT

As reported by the Senate Higher Education Committee on March 11, 2021, with amendments.

1 AN ACT establishing a commission to study beneficial relationships
 2 between institutions of higher education and municipalities.

 4 **BE IT ENACTED** *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*
 5 *of New Jersey:*

 7 1. a. There is established a study commission for the purpose
 8 of examining the development of mutually beneficial relationships
 9 between institutions of higher education and the municipalities in
 10 which the institutions are located. The commission shall consist of
 11 ¹[15] ²[16¹] 17² members as follows:

12 (1) the Secretary of Higher Education, or a designee ²and the
 13 Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the
 14 Department of Community Affairs, or a designee²;

15 (2) ¹[ten] 11¹ members appointed by the Governor, including a
 16 representative of the State colleges and universities established
 17 pursuant to chapter 64 of Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes, a
 18 representative of the public research universities, a representative of
 19 the county colleges, a representative of the independent colleges
 20 and universities, a mayor or designee of a municipality in which a
 21 State college or university is located, a mayor or designee of a
 22 municipality in which a public research university is located, a
 23 mayor or designee of a municipality in which a county college is
 24 located, a mayor or designee of a municipality in which an
 25 independent college or university is located, a representative of the
 26 New Jersey State League of Municipalities, ¹a representative of the
 27 American Federation of Teachers,¹ and a representative of the New
 28 Jersey Education Association; and

29 (3) four members of the public with demonstrated expertise or
 30 interest in issues related to the work of the commission. The
 31 President of the Senate, the Speaker of the General Assembly, the
 32 Minority Leader of the Senate, and the Minority Leader of the
 33 General Assembly shall each appoint one of the public members.

34 b. Appointments to the commission shall be made within 30
 35 days of the effective date of this act. Vacancies in the membership
 36 of the commission shall be filled in the same manner as the original
 37 appointments were made.

38 c. Members of the commission shall serve without
 39 compensation but shall be reimbursed for necessary expenses
 40 incurred in the performance of their duties within the limits of funds
 41 made available to the commission for its purposes.

42
 43 2. a. The commission shall organize as soon as practicable,
 44 but no later than 30 days following the appointment of its members.

1 The commission shall choose a chairperson from among its
2 members and shall appoint a secretary who need not be a member
3 of the commission.

4 b. The Office of the Secretary of Higher Education shall
5 provide such professional staff and related support services as the
6 commission requires to carry out its work. The commission also
7 shall be entitled to call to its assistance and avail itself of the
8 services of the employees of any State, county, or municipal
9 department, board, bureau, commission, or agency as it may require
10 and as may be available to it for its purposes.

11
12 3. It shall be the duty of the study commission to examine the
13 creation and implementation of mutually beneficial relationships
14 between the State's institutions of higher education and the
15 municipalities in which the institutions are located. The
16 commission shall study and consider issues including, but not
17 limited to, the following:

18 a. ways in which institutions of higher education and
19 municipalities may work closely together to foster relationships that
20 will benefit the institution, the institution's students, and the
21 community;

22 b. ways to increase the engagement of institutions of higher
23 education with their surrounding communities in order to address
24 and respond to community needs;

25 c. specific types of structured partnerships that may mutually
26 benefit institutions of higher education and their surrounding
27 communities including, but not limited to, partnerships related to
28 academic programs, research, student internship and work
29 opportunities, and community service and outreach;

30 d. the process by which an institution of higher education may
31 acquire additional land, including whether the municipality should
32 be required to approve the procurement of new land; and

33 e. recommendations or best practices for institutions of higher
34 education and municipalities regarding the creation and
35 implementation of mutually beneficial relationships and
36 partnerships.

37
38 4. The commission shall issue a report of its findings and
39 recommendations to the Governor, and to the Legislature pursuant
40 to section 2 of P.L.1991, c.164 (C.52:14-19.1), no later than 12
41 months after the commission organizes.

43 5. This act shall take effect immediately, and the commission
44 shall expire 30 days after the submission of its report.
