- 1. a. The Commissioner of Education shall establish a three-year pilot program that provides grant funding to <sup>1</sup>encourage and support <sup>1</sup> school districts to <sup>1</sup>establish For Inspiration and Recognition of Science and Technology (FIRST) nonprofit organization's robotics programs and <sup>1</sup> participate in <sup>1</sup>a <sup>1</sup> FIRST Robotics <sup>1</sup>[Competitions] Competition <sup>1</sup>. The purpose of the pilot program shall be to:
- (1) increase opportunities for students to participate in <sup>1</sup><u>a</u><sup>1</sup> FIRST Robotics <sup>1</sup>[Competitions] Competition <sup>1</sup>;
- (2) motivate students to pursue education and career opportunities in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics; and
- (3) improve students' knowledge in the fields of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics.
- b. A school district that wants to participate in the pilot program shall submit an application to the commissioner in such form as required by the commissioner. The school district shall select no more than one school serving students from grades nine through 12 to participate in the pilot program.
- c. The commissioner shall select up to 12 school districts for participation in the pilot program. The commissioner shall select districts in the northern, central, and southern regions of the State and shall seek a cross section of school districts from urban, suburban, and rural areas of the State. The <sup>1</sup>school districts selected by the <sup>1</sup> commissioner shall <sup>1</sup>[award] be eligible for <sup>1</sup> grants, within the limit of available <sup>1</sup>[State appropriations] funds that are donated pursuant to subsection d. of this section<sup>1</sup>, to <sup>1</sup>[selected school districts to]<sup>1</sup> be used to support the development and implementation of a FIRST <sup>1</sup>[Robotics Program] <u>robotics program</u> in the selected schools. The <sup>1</sup>[commissioner] <u>FIRST nonprofit organization</u> <sup>1</sup> shall determine the amount of each grant awarded under the program and may award multi-year grants. Grants awarded pursuant to this subsection shall be used by school districts to provide coaching stipends, purchase materials for competitions, finance competition travel expenses, and register for events. School districts selected by the commissioner to participate in the pilot program may apply for additional funding as teams in the school district become eligible to participate in <sup>1</sup>the<sup>1</sup> FIRST <sup>1</sup>[Robotics Program's] robotics program's district, district championship, and world championship events.
- d. The commissioner shall collaborate with the FIRST nonprofit organization, educational advocacy groups, and private sector
