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AN ACT concerning the certification of tax collectors and amending 1 2 P.L.1979, c.384. 3 4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 5 of New Jersey: 6 7 1. Section 2 of P.L.1979, c.384 (C.40A:9-145.2) is amended to 8 read as follows: 9 2. a. Commencing on the effective date of [this act] P.L.1979, 10 c.384 (C.40A:9-145.1 et seq.), the director shall hold examinations 11 for certification as a tax collector semi-annually [,] and at such 12 other times as [he] the director may determine appropriate [, for 13 certification as tax collector]. An applicant for examination shall furnish proof to the director, not less than 30 days before an 14 15 examination, that the applicant: (1) is not less than 21 years of age [,]; 16 17 (2) is a citizen of the United States [,] ; 18 (3) is of good moral character [,] ; 19 (4) has obtained a certificate or diploma issued after at least four 20 years of study in an approved secondary school or has received an 21 academic education considered and accepted by the Commissioner 22 of Education as fully equivalent; 23 (5) has graduated from a four-year course at an institution of 24 higher education of recognized standing, or has not less than two 25 years' full-time experience in tax collection, or has at least one 26 year's full-time experience in tax collection and 30 credit hours at 27 an institution of higher education of recognized standing; and possesses certificates of completion of Municipal Tax 28 (6)29 Collection I, II, and III courses [offered by] from the Division of 30 Local Government Services in the Department of Community 31 Affairs or, with the division's approval, Rutgers, The State 32 University [which courses shall be approved by the Division of 33 Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs] of New Jersey, or any other college or university. 34 35 b. For the purpose of this section, experience in tax collection 36 [must] shall include experience in the following areas: lien 37 enforcement, tax collecting, tax billing, and reporting [, and,] . An applicant's experience in tax collection shall be attested to by the 38 39 tax collector of the employing municipality. 40 [The] An applicant shall furnish the proofs required c. 41 pursuant to this section [shall be provided] to the director on such application forms and in such manner as shall be prescribed by the 42 43 director. Each completed application form shall be accompanied by 44 a fee in the amount of \$50 payable to the order of the State

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1 Treasurer and shall be filed with the director at least 30 days prior 2 to the date of the examination. Examinations shall be written, or 3 both written and oral, and shall be of such character as fairly to test and determine the qualifications, fitness and ability of the person 4 5 tested to actually perform the duties of tax collector. [Commencing with examinations given] (1) On and after 6 d. 7 the effective date of P.L.1999, c.300, the examination shall be given 8 in sections on the subjects of: 9 (a) lien enforcement; 10 (b) tax collecting, tax billing, and reporting; 11 (c) policies and practices relating to tax collection in a municipality operating under [a] the State fiscal year; and 12 13 (d) any other material as determined appropriate by the director 14 and in sections as determined necessary. The director shall notify 15 applicants of the nature of any such other material at the time the 16 examinations are announced. 17 (2) On and after the effective date of P.L., c. (C.) 18 (pending before the Legislature as this bill), the examination shall 19 be given in sections on the subjects of: 20 (a) lien enforcement; 21 (b) tax collecting, tax billing, and reporting; and 22 (c) any other material as determined appropriate by the director 23 and in sections as determined necessary. The director shall notify 24 applicants of the nature of any such other material at the time the 25 examinations are announced. 26 (3) There shall be no limit on the number of times an applicant 27 may sit for any section of the examination. When an examination 28 section or sections are taken separately, the fee for registering for a 29 single examination sitting shall not exceed \$25. 30 e. [A] (1) For examinations given prior to the effective date 31 of P.L., c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature as this bill), a 32 person shall not be required to pass the State fiscal year section of 33 the examination in order to receive certification as a tax collector, 34 except that any such certification shall be noted as restricted to 35 serve in a municipality operating under a calendar fiscal year; and such a person shall not serve as tax collector in a municipality 36 37 operating under [a] the State fiscal year until such time the person successfully passes the State fiscal year section of the examination. 38 39 The director shall note that a person has passed the State fiscal year 40 section of the examination by appropriately noting the fact on the 41 person's certificate. Notwithstanding the provisions of this 42 subsection, nothing shall preclude a certified tax collector who, prior to the effective date of P.L.1999, c.300, serves, served, or 43 44 successfully passed the certified tax collector examination, from 45 being appointed as a tax collector in a municipality operating under 46 a State fiscal year. 47 (2) On and after the effective date of P.L., c. (C.) 48 (pending before the Legislature as this bill), a person shall not serve

1 as a tax collector in a municipality operating under the State fiscal year unless the person possesses: 2 3 (a) a certificate of completion for a State fiscal year tax 4 collection course offered through the Division of Local Government 5 Services in the Department of Community Affairs; and (b) a State fiscal year endorsement on the person's tax collector 6 7 certificate. The registration fee for a person to sit for the State 8 fiscal year tax collection course shall be \$250, or such other amount 9 as the director may promulgate by rules and regulations in 10 accordance with the "Administrative Procedure Act," P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et seq.), and shall be payable to the order of the 11 12 State Treasurer. 13 (3) Notwithstanding any provision of this section to the 14 contrary, a municipality operating under the State fiscal year may 15 appoint a person as a tax collector if: 16 (a) prior to the effective date of P.L.1999, c.300, the person 17 served as a tax collector or successfully passed the certified tax 18 collector examination; or 19 (b) the person is a certified tax collector and successfully passed 20 the State fiscal year section of a certified tax collector examination 21 prior to the effective date of P.L., c. (C.) (pending before the 22 Legislature as this bill). 23 (cf: P.L.1999, c.300, s.1) 24 25 2. Section 3 of P.L.1979, c.384 (C.40A:9-145.3) is amended to 26 read as follows: 27 3. <u>a.</u> Upon the successful completion of the examination by an 28 applicant, a tax collector certificate shall be issued to [him] the 29 applicant, upon the payment of an additional fee of \$50 payable to 30 the order of the State Treasurer. 31 b. Upon the successful completion by an applicant of a State 32 fiscal year tax collection course pursuant to subsection e. of section 33 2 of P.L.1979, c.384 (C.40A:9-145.2), the Division of Local 34 Government Services shall add a State fiscal year endorsement to 35 the tax collector certificate, upon proper application for the 36 endorsement and payment of the application fee. The application 37 fee to add a State fiscal year endorsement to a tax collector 38 certificate shall be \$25, or such other amount as the director may 39 prescribe, by rules and regulations in accordance with the "Administrative Procedure Act," P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et 40 41 seq.), and shall be payable to the order of the State Treasurer. The 42 director may prescribe the manner in which a person may apply for 43 a State fiscal year endorsement to a tax collector certificate. 44 (cf: P.L.1993, c.25, s.2) 45 3. This act shall take effect on the first day of the seventh 46 47 month next following enactment, except that the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of

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Community Affairs may take any anticipatory administrative action
 in advance thereof as may be necessary for the implementation of
 this act.
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STATEMENT

8 This bill revises the manner by which a tax collector may 9 become certified in the collection of property taxes in 10 municipalities that operate on the State fiscal year budget cycle, 11 rather than on a calendar year budget cycle.

Currently, a candidate for certification as a tax collector is 12 required to take, and pass, an additional portion of the certification 13 14 test related to State fiscal year tax collection in order to serve as a 15 tax collector in a State fiscal year municipality. Many candidates do not elect to take the State fiscal year portion of the examination. 16 This has resulted in comparatively fewer certified tax collectors 17 who are certified to serve as a tax collector in a municipality that 18 operates on a State fiscal year budget cycle. 19 20 This bill would revise the process for certification as a tax

collector for State fiscal year municipalities by allowing a candidate
to simply take an additional course in order to attain that
certification.
