SYNOPSIS

Requires health care facilities to report certain coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) data related to health care workers and certain first responders.

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AN ACT concerning data reporting related to the coronavirus
disease 2019 pandemic.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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7 1. a. (1) The Commissioner of Health shall require general acute care hospitals, special hospitals, ambulatory care facilities, 8 9 ambulatory surgical centers, ¹assisted living facilities, home health agencies,¹ and nursing homes licensed pursuant to P.L.1971, c.136 10 (C.26:2H-1 et seq.)¹, as well as hospice programs licensed pursuant 11 to P.L.1997, c.78 (C.26:2H-79 et seq.),¹ to report to the Department 12 of Health¹, either directly or through a non-profit trade association, 13 on a bi-monthly basis, de-identified¹ data on the number of health 14 care professionals, ancillary health care workers, and emergency 15 medical services personnel ¹[affiliated with] employed by¹ the 16 facility who ¹[:]¹ tested positive for the coronavirus disease 2019 17 ¹[;] <u>and who</u>¹ died from the coronavirus disease 2019 ¹[; and were 18 19 admitted for treatment for the coronavirus disease 2019]¹.

20 (2) ¹[The commissioner shall compile the data reported 21 pursuant to this subsection by facility type and by professional 22 license or certification type, if any, or by job title or category] The 23 information required pursuant to this subsection shall be filed in a 24 form and manner as shall be required by the department. To ensure 25 the integrity and accuracy of the information reported pursuant to 26 this subsection, the department shall seek to identify and minimize 27 duplicative reporting from multiple facilities concerning the same individual in the event that the individual is employed by, or 28 29 affiliated with, more than one facility that is subject to the reporting 30 requirements set forth in this section¹.

31 b. The department shall ¹ [publish on its Internet website] issue <u>a report concerning¹</u> the occupational data received pursuant to 32 subsection a. of this section ${}^{1}\mathbf{I}$. The department shall update its 33 Internet website on a daily basis by publishing the latest data 34 received by the department pursuant to subsection a. of this section. 35 36 To the extent possible, the data reported by the department pursuant 37 to this subsection may be merged and cross-referenced with the data 38 published by the department pursuant to subsection b. of section 1 39 of P.L.2020, c.28] no later than 12 months after the end of both the state of emergency and public health emergency declared in 40 41 response to the coronavirus disease 2019 pandemic.

c. Nothing in this section shall be construed to require 1 disclosure of any private health information or personal identifying 2 3 information in violation of any State or federal law, including the federal "Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 4 5 1996," Pub.L.104-191 and any regulations promulgated thereunder by the Secretary of the U.S. Department of Health and Human 6 7 <u>Services</u>¹. 8 9 2. This act shall take effect immediately and shall expire one 10 month after ¹[the end of both the state of emergency and the public health emergency declared in response to the coronavirus disease 11 12 2019 pandemic] issuance of the report required pursuant to
