SYNOPSIS

Establishes Water Apprenticeship, Training, and Resources Pilot Program in DOLWD.

CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT

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1 AN ACT establishing a Water Apprenticeship, Training, and 2 Resources ("WATER") Pilot Program and supplementing P.L.1992, c.43 (C.34:15D-1 et seq.). 3 4 5 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 6 of New Jersey: 7 8 There is established in the Department of Labor and 1. a. 9 Workforce Development a five year Water Apprenticeship, Training, 10 and Employment Resources ("WATER") Pilot Program, which shall 11 provide grants to support funding for adult apprenticeship programs in 12 water infrastructure, water utilities, and other water-related sectors, ¹including, but not limited to, those employing wastewater workers,¹ 13 14 focusing on underserved and underrepresented communities. A grant 15 may extend beyond one year in duration. To be eligible for the grant, 16 the apprenticeship program shall be accredited and approved by the United States Department of Labor, or shall be in the process of 17 18 obtaining that accreditation. The program shall be administered by the 19 Office of ¹[Customized Training] <u>Apprenticeship</u>¹ in the department. 20 b. To apply for the grant, an organization shall submit an application to the Office of ¹ [Customized Training] <u>Apprenticeship</u>¹, 21 which shall include documentation that the apprenticeship which the 22 23 organization is sponsoring is or will be accredited and approved by the 24 United States Department of Labor. Any organizational sponsor of an 25 apprenticeship program is eligible to receive the grant, including: 26 (1) businesses; 27 (2) labor organizations; 28 (3) colleges; 29 (4) workforce training providers; and 30 (5) non-profit organizations¹; 31 (6) public utilities; (7) local government entities and authorities; and 32 33 (8) trade organizations¹. 34 c. No later than July 1, 2021, the department shall begin 35 accepting grant applications to be awarded no later than January 1, 36 2022 from funds allocated to the program. The department shall rank 37 eligible applicants for grants based upon: 38 (1) each applicant's potential to: 39 (a) reach a broad audience through its recruitment and outreach 40 efforts: (b) significantly increase enrollment and completion of the 41 42 apprenticeship program, including enrollment by underserved and 43 underrepresented communities; and 44 (c) fill existing needs for skilled workers in the market; and EXPLANATION - Matter enclosed in **bold-faced** brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

1 (2) the applicant's partnership with an industry for which 2 apprenticeship programs targeted at training and providing skilled 3 workers who have the ability to perform jobs in that industry have 4 demonstrated positive outcomes.

d. An eligible applicant is required to demonstrate that it intends
and is prepared to contribute its own financial resources to the
apprenticeship program and has secured an industry partner or a
monetary or in-kind contribution, including conditional job placement
guarantees, from an industry partner. Moreover, each eligible applicant
shall provide documentation of:

(1) the apprenticeship program's curriculum, location, and skills tobe taught;

(2) the recruitment efforts for the apprenticeship program, andprojected enrollment with and without receipt of grant funds;

15 (3) a description of how the grant funds will be utilized;

16 (4) information on specific industry needs or gaps in the workforce17 that will be addressed by the apprenticeship program;

(5) costs to operate the apprenticeship program; and

(6) any other information the department requires.

An eligible applicant shall partner with schools, utilities, water purveyors, and other water employers to effectively market these opportunities; strengthen local hiring preferences in support of more minority and women business enterprises, and hold an annual water summit where prospective workers, employers, and community partners can connect.

26 e. An eligible applicant who is selected by the department for 27 receipt of a grant for the purpose of funding an apprenticeship program 28 in accordance with P.L. , c. (C.) (pending before the 29 Legislature as this bill), shall, on an annual basis for so long as the 30 grant is provided, make an annual report to the commissioner detailing 31 the enrollment in the program, the number of participants completing the program, the number of participants obtaining employment as a 32 33 result of the program, and any other information as the commissioner 34 may require.

35 f. Beginning January 1, 2022, and each year thereafter for the 36 duration of the pilot grant program, the Commissioner of Labor and 37 Workforce Development shall submit to the Governor, and to the 38 Legislature, pursuant to section 2 of P.L.1991, c.164 (C.52:14-19.1), a 39 report that evaluates the results of the program and its effectiveness in 40 preparing individuals to meet existing and burgeoning workforce 41 needs and addressing gaps in skills in the workforce. The report shall 42 include a recommendation regarding whether to renew the WATER 43 Pilot Program, and if renewal is recommended, if the program should 44 be expanded or otherwise enhanced. The report shall include:

45 (1) The number of grants awarded in the prior year, including the46 amount, recipient, and duration of each grant;

47 (2) The number of individuals who enrolled in and completed an48 apprenticeship program offered by each grant recipient;

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1 (3) The number of individuals who obtained employment in a 2 position that uses the skills for which they were trained by a grant 3 recipient, or in a position for which the completion of the 4 apprenticeship program was a condition of employment; and 5 (4) All relevant information provided by grant recipients as to 6 measurable outcomes of participants. 7 g. Funds from grants provided in accordance with 8) (pending before the Legislature as this bill) shall P.L., c. (C. 9 not be used: 10 (1) for any activities which replace, supplant, compete with, or 11 duplicate in any way existing approved apprenticeship programs; 12 (2) to induce, encourage, or assist any displacement of currently-13 employed workers by trainees, including partial displacement by 14 means such as reduced hours of currently employed workers; any 15 replacement of laid-off workers by trainees; or any relocation of 16 operations resulting in a loss of employment at a previous workplace; 17 or

18 (3) to impair existing contracts for services or collective 19 bargaining agreements, except that activities which would be 20 inconsistent with the terms of a collective bargaining agreement may 21 be undertaken with the written concurrence of the collective 22 bargaining unit and the employer or employers who are parties to the 23 agreement.

h. As used in P.L. , c. (C.) (pending before theLegislature as this bill):

26 "Eligible applicant" means a business, labor organization, college, 27 workforce training provider, non-profit organization, or any other 28 entity that offers or plans to offer an apprenticeship program that is 29 accredited and approved by the United States Department of Labor and 30 that has partnered with an industry to offer or fund the apprenticeship 31 program.

32 "Department" means the Department of Labor and Workforce33 Development.

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35 2. There is established in the Department of the Treasury a special non-lapsing fund to be known as the WATER Fund. The 36 37 fund shall consist of: all monies appropriated by the Legislature for 38 inclusion in the fund, investment earnings of the fund, and moneys 39 contributed to the fund by private sources, to be used for the 40 purposes of P.L., c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature as 41 this bill). The moneys in the fund shall be invested and reinvested by the ¹[Director of the Division of Investment in the]¹ Department 42 of the Treasury. The ¹[department] Department of Labor and 43 44 Workforce Development¹ shall solicit grants from interested public or private sources for the fund. 45

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47 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
