Revises composition and certain functions of New Jersey State Firemen's Home.

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AN ACT concerning the New Jersey Firemen's Home and supplementing and amending various sections of the statutory law and repealing R.S.54:18-8.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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1. R.S.30:7-1 is amended to read as follows:

9 30:7-1. The board of managers of the New Jersey Firemen's 10 Home, notwithstanding the provisions of any other law to the contrary, shall consist of the president of the New Jersey State 11 12 Firemen's Association, the Governor of the State, the State 13 Commissioner of Banking and Insurance and the State Comptroller, 14 and one member elected from each county of the State and one 15 additional member who shall be a fully paid fireman, elected from 16 each of the counties of Essex and Hudson]. The [president of the 17 firemen's association, the **J** Governor, the Commissioner of Banking 18 and Insurance and the State Comptroller, respectively, for the time 19 being, shall be ex-officio members of the board of managers.

20 The elected members shall be elected by New Jersey State Firemen's Association in annual convention assembled. They] The 21 members from each county shall be firemen who submit 22 23 applications from their respective county, have served in the fire 24 service for a minimum of five years, and are in good standing. Upon 25 application, the board of managers shall vote upon the appointment of county applicants at the annual September meeting of the board 26 27 of managers.

<u>The managers</u> shall hold office for a term of four years from the
 [first day] <u>second Saturday</u> of October next succeeding their
 election and until their successors are elected [and qualify] <u>at the</u>
 <u>annual reorganization meeting of managers</u>.

32 A vacancy occurring among [the elected members] the managers other than by expiration of a term shall be filled [as 33 34 follows: The president of the <u>by appointment of the chairman of</u> 35 the board of managers of the New Jersey State Firemen's 36 [Association shall appoint] <u>Home</u> from the county in which the 37 vacancy occurred [a] . The successor [to] shall serve [until the 38 first day of October next succeeding the appointment and at the next 39 annual meeting of the association there shall be elected from the 40 county in which the vacancy occurred a member to serve for] the balance of the unexpired term. 41

The members shall receive no compensation for their service but
may be reimbursed their actual expenses in connection with their
duties as managers from the funds of the home.

1 2. (New section) The New Jersey Firemen's Home shall have 2 the authority to: 3 purchase, construct, lease and operate a licensed long-term a. 4 residential care facility; and 5 b. borrow money and secure the same by mortgage upon any 6 property held or to be held by it, subject to the approval of the 7 Governor, for capital improvements, including the construction of a 8 new facility or an additional wing of an existing facility. 9 10 3. R.S.54:18-1 is amended to read as follows: 11 54:18-1. Each insurer, not organized under the laws of the State 12 of New Jersey, which takes fire insurance risks on property in this State, shall on or before March 1 in each year, for the period during 13 the 12 months ending December 31 of the preceding year, cause to 14 be made to the <u>State</u> Treasurer **[**of the New Jersey State Firemen's 15 Association], on behalf of each municipality or fire district in this 16 17 State, for any property on which the insurer has taken any fire 18 insurance risk situate therein, a true return in writing, verified by 19 the oath of an officer or representative of the insurer, showing the 20 amount of all premiums received by or agreed to be paid to the 21 insurer, for insurance underwritten by that insurer against loss or 22 injury by fire upon real or personal property, except automobiles that are not stored for sale, including loss of use thereof in the 23 municipality, or fire district. The return also shall contain the 24 Insurance Services Office "ISO" numerical identification code [or 25 designation] assigned [by the New Jersey State Firemen's 26 27 Association for [such] the municipality or fire district. The 28 insurer shall, on or before March 1 of each year, pay to the State 29 Treasurer [of the New Jersey State Firemen's Association] the sum 30 of 2% upon the amount of all the premiums received or agreed to be 31 paid during the 12 months ending December 31 of the preceding 32 year. 33 If the insurer fails to comply herewith, and the failure is reported 34 to the Commissioner of Banking and Insurance in writing, Lattested 35 by the oath of the Treasurer of the New Jersey State Firemen's Association,] then the commissioner shall forthwith revoke the 36 certificate of authority issued to the insurer, and, until the 37 38 provisions of this chapter have been complied with by the insurer, it 39 shall not transact further business in this State. 40 (cf: P.L.1997, c.41, s.1)

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42 4. R.S.54:18-2 is amended to read as follows:

54:18-2. If any person residing or having an office or place of
business in this State, in the capacity either of agent, broker, or
insurer shall effect, or cause to be effected, any insurance, or shall
receive any application for the effecting of insurance upon property
in any municipality or fire district in this State, and shall directly or

1 indirectly place the insurance or cause the same to be placed in an 2 insurer not organized under the laws of this State, the agent, broker 3 or insurer shall make a return to the <u>State</u> Treasurer [of the New 4 Jersey State Firemen's Association] on behalf of the municipality or 5 fire district in which the property is situate, as set forth in 6 R.S.54:18-1, on or before March 1 in each year. The return shall 7 contain an account, under oath, of all premiums received by such 8 agent, broker or insurer, or by any other person for him, or agreed 9 to be paid, during the 12 months ending December 31 of the 10 preceding year, for insurance against loss or injury by fire upon real 11 or personal property, except automobiles that are not stored for sale, 12 including loss of use thereof in the municipality or fire district. The 13 return also shall contain the Insurance Services Office "ISO" 14 numerical identification code [or designation assigned by the New Jersey State Firemen's Association] of [such] the municipality or 15 16 fire district. The agent, broker or insurer shall, on or before March 17 1 of each year, pay to the <u>State</u> Treasurer of the New Jersey State Firemen's Association] the sum of 2% upon the amount of all the 18 19 premiums received or agreed to be paid as aforesaid within the 12 20 months ending December 31 of the preceding year. The State Treasurer [of the New Jersey State Firemen's Association] shall 21 22 allocate the tax monies received to the appropriate local firemen's 23 relief association incorporated and affiliated with the State 24 association, collected on behalf of the municipality or fire district 25 under the control thereof, and to the Board of Managers of the New 26 Jersey Firemen's Home. Any monies received, allocated or paid by 27 any agent, broker or insurer pursuant to the provisions of this 28 chapter on behalf of any municipality or fire district that does not 29 have a local firemen's relief association affiliated with the New 30 Jersey State Firemen's Association shall be allocated to the New 31 Jersey Firemen's Home in accordance with the provisions of section 32 7 of P.L.1997, c.41 (C.54:18-8).

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5. R.S.54:18-3 is amended to read as follows:

36 54:18-3. Every agent, broker, or insurer residing or having an 37 office or authorized or licensed to do business in this State shall 38 make the return and payment as set forth in R.S.54:18-2 and shall 39 keep accurate books of account of all business done by him. The 40 agent, broker or insurer shall record the name of the insured, the 41 date and expiration of the insurance, a description of the property 42 insured, a statement of its location, including the Insurance Services 43 Office "ISO" numerical identification code or designation of the 44 municipality or fire district, the amount of the insurance and 45 premiums paid therefor. If an agent, broker or insurer fails, 46 neglects or refuses to comply with any provisions of this chapter, or 47 if any fraud or dishonesty in the returns required pursuant to the

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1 provisions of this chapter is apparent or becomes known, the State 2 Treasurer [of the New Jersey State Firemen's Association], on behalf of the municipality or fire district, may obtain from a judge 3 4 of the Superior Court, in the county wherein the insured property is 5 located, an order compelling the agent, broker or insurer to produce 6 all books and records required to be kept by this chapter for an 7 accounting and examination by the court. 8 (cf: P.L.1997, c.41, s.3) 9 10 6. R.S.54:18-4 is amended to read as follows: 11 54:18-4. Any such agent, broker or insurer who fails, neglects or refuses to keep books of account as required, or to produce them in 12 13 the Superior Court upon an order of the court, or to make proper 14 and accurate returns as hereinbefore provided, or to pay over the 15 percentage due upon any premium as required, at the time and in 16 the manner specified in this chapter, or who is found, upon 17 examination by the court, to have made a false return of the 18 business done by him, shall, for each offense, be guilty of a crime 19 of the fourth degree and forfeit and pay the amount owed to the State Treasurer [of the New Jersey State Firemen's Association]. 20 21 (cf: P.L.1997, c.41, s.4) 22 23 7. R.S.54:18-5 is amended to read as follows: 24 54:18-5. If any such agent, broker or insurer fails, neglects or 25 refuses to pay any percentage herein provided for, or to pay and 26 satisfy any forfeiture or penalty adjudged to be due under the 27 provisions of this chapter, and that fact is reported to the Commissioner of Banking and Insurance in writing, Lattested by the 28 29 oath of the Treasurer of the New Jersey State Firemen's 30 Association, the commissioner shall forthwith revoke any certificate of authority previously issued under which the failure has 31 32 occurred. The revocation of a certificate shall not release any 33 penalty or forfeiture previously incurred. 34 (cf: P.L.1997, c.41, s.5) 35 36 8. R.S.54:18-7 is amended to read as follows: 37 54:18-7. This chapter shall not alter or abridge any reciprocal 38 legislation existing between different states of the United States, in 39 regard to the percentage of taxes collected and received for this 40 State. The amount of premiums paid by any insurance company 41 pursuant to this chapter shall be deemed part of the reciprocal tax to 42 be collected for this State. The Commissioner of Banking and 43 Insurance, in consultation with the Treasurer of the State of New 44 Jersey, shall enforce the provisions of this chapter [and shall 45 require the Treasurer of the New Jersey State Firemen's Association to provide a certified annual accounting of the monies received and 46 47 allocated under the provisions of this chapter and R.S.43:17-1 et

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1 seq., and shall hold the treasurer and officers accountable and 2 subject to the penalties provided herein]. 3 (cf: P.L.1997, c.41, s.6) 4 5 9. (New section) All monies received from the two percent tax 6 on fire insurance premiums paid by insurance companies not incorporated in this State on behalf of all municipalities or fire 7 8 districts, regardless of whether the municipalities or fire districts 9 have a duly incorporated local firemen's relief association affiliated 10 with the New Jersey State Firemen's Association pursuant to 11 R.S.43:17-1 et seq., shall first be dedicated to the New Jersey 12 Firemen's Home in the amount of the full sum of its annual budget, as approved by the Governor. The State Treasurer shall remit 13 14 monies to fund the annual budget of the New Jersey Firemen's 15 Home on or before the first day in May of each year. 16 The balance of the funds shall be dedicated to and for the benefit 17 of firemen throughout the State, as determined by the Governor. 18 19 10. R.S.54:18-8 is repealed. 20 21 11. This act shall take effect immediately. 22 23 STATEMENT 24 25 26 This bill revises certain procedures related to the management of 27 the New Jersey Firemen's Home. The New Jersey Firemen's Home 28 is the only licensed health care facility in this State that provides 29 long term care and residential services exclusively for New Jersey 30 firefighters. 31 The Fireman's Home is governed by a board of managers who, 32 subject to the approval of the Governor, direct and control its 33 property and concerns; make by-laws, rules, and regulations; and 34 determine the compensation, duties, and term of service of its 35 officers and employees. Under current law, the board of managers consists of the President of the New Jersey State Firemen's 36 37 Association, the Governor of the State, the State Commissioner of 38 Banking and Insurance and the State Comptroller, one member 39 elected from each county, and one additional member who is a fully 40 paid fireman, elected from Essex and Hudson counties. This bill 41 removes from the board of managers the President of the New Jersey 42 Fireman's Association and the additional members from Essex and 43 Hudson counties. The bill also provides that the members from each 44 county are to be firemen who submit applications from their 45 respective county, have served in the fire service for a minimum of 46 five years, and are in good standing. Upon application, the board of 47 managers are to vote upon the appointment of county applicants at 48 the annual September meeting of the board of managers.

1 In addition, the bill revises the procedures by which managers of 2 the New Jersey Firemen's Home are elected and their vacancies are 3 filled. Under current law, members are elected by the New Jersey 4 Fireman's Association to serve four-year terms and membership 5 vacancies are filled by the president of the New Jersey Firemen's Association. Under the bill, the managers are to be elected by the 6 7 New Jersey Firemen's Home for four-year terms. Membership 8 vacancies also would filled by the chairman of the board of 9 managers to serve the balance of the unexpired term.

The bill also grants the New Jersey Firemen's Home the power and authority to purchase, construct, lease and operate a licensed long-term residential care facility. The New Jersey Firemen's Home also would have the authority to borrow money and secure a mortgage for capital improvements, including the construction of an additional facility or a new wing of an existing facility.

16 Under current law, R.S.43:17-1 et seq. provides for the 17 establishment of a firemen's relief organization in any municipality 18 where there are organized one or more fire companies. The purpose of 19 the relief association is to establish and maintain a fund for the relief, 20 support, or burial of indigent exempt firemen and their families. These 21 local associations are funded by monies received from a two percent 22 tax on the premiums of foreign and alien insurers transacting fire 23 insurance in this State. The Treasurer of the New Jersey State 24 Firemen's Association then distributes the tax monies to (1) each local 25 firemen's relief association depending upon the amount of revenue 26 derived the from insurance policies written in that municipality, and 27 (2) the managers of the New Jersey Firemen's Home pursuant to the 28 home's annual budget.

This bill requires these tax moneys to be paid to the State Treasurer, rather than the Treasurer of the New Jersey State Firemen's Association. The State Treasurer would then allocates the funds to cover the costs of the relief associations and New Jersey Firemen's Home.

34 Finally this bill repeals R.S.54:18-8, which requires a two percent 35 tax on the premiums of fire insurance policies written by out-of-36 State insurance companies on New Jersey properties. This tax is 37 currently paid to the New Jersey State Fireman's Association, 38 which distributes a portion of the tax receipts to the New Jersey 39 Firemen's Home based on the home's annual budget and distributes 40 a portion to the local firemen's relief associations. The two percent 41 tax that is paid by insurance companies on behalf of municipalities or fire districts which do not have a local firemen's relief 42 43 association are dedicated to the New Jersey Firemen's Home. If 44 there are not sufficient funds for the annual operating expenses of 45 the New Jersey Firemen's Home, the Treasurer of the New Jersey 46 State Fireman's Association is required to pay the difference. In 47 addition, capital projects for the New Jersey State Firemen's Home

are required to be approved by the officers of the New Jersey State
 Fireman's Association.

3 Under the provisions of this bill, all monies received by the 4 Treasurer of the State of New Jersey from the two percent tax paid 5 by insurance companies not incorporated in this State on behalf of all municipalities or fire districts, regardless of whether the 6 7 municipalities or fire districts have a local firemen's relief 8 association, are required to first be dedicated to the New Jersey 9 Firemen's Home in the full sum of the annual budget, as approved 10 by the Governor. The State Treasurer is to remit monies to fund the annual budget of the New Jersey Firemen's Home on or before May 11 1st of each year. The balance of the funds are required to be 12 13 dedicated to and for the benefit of firefighters throughout the State, 14 as determined by the Governor. In addition, the bill removes the 15 requirement for the New Jersey State Fireman's Association to 16 approve capital projects.

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
