SYNOPSIS

Defines information required to be included in death certificates.

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1 AN ACT concerning death certificates and amending Title 26 of the 2 **Revised Statutes.** 3 4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 5 of New Jersey: 6 7 1. R.S.26:6-7 is amended to read as follows: 26:6-7. a. The certificate of death shall contain such items as 8 9 shall be listed on death certificate forms or in the NJ-EDRS provided or approved by the department under the authority of 10 subsection c. of R.S.26:8-24. The death certificate forms or the 11 12 record in the NJ-EDRS shall include, but not be limited to, the 13 following items: 14 (1) name of the decedent; 15 (2) county or municipality in which the death occurred; 16 (3) date of death; 17 (4) sex of decedent, as provided for in paragraph b. of this 18 section; 19 (5) date of birth; and 20 (6) date of issuance and manner of death, providing this information is available. 21 22 b. The sex of the decedent, shall be recorded to reflect the 23 decedent's gender identity, as reported by the next of kin or the best 24 qualified person available, unless the person completing the death certificate is presented with a document that memorializes the 25 26 decedent's gender transition. 27 In case of conflicting information on the sex of the decedent from the sources, the death certificate shall be based on 28 29 documentation that memorializes the decedent's gender transition. If documentation is not available, it shall be based on information 30 31 from individuals most familiar with the decedent's gender identity 32 at the time of death. Documents that may memorialize a gender 33 transition include: written instructions from the decedent; a court 34 order approving a name or gender change; an advance health care 35 directive; documentation of an appropriate course of treatment for the purpose of gender transition; or documentation of a change to 36 37 the gender marker on a birth certificate, or a state or federally 38 issued identification card. 39 (cf: P.L.2003, c.221, s.4) 40 2. The Commissioner of Health shall adopt rules and 41 42 regulations pursuant to the "Administrative Procedure Act," 43 P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et seq.), to effectuate the purposes of 44 this act. 45 46 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

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STATEMENT

This bill would provide for the inclusion of certain information in the certified copy of a death record. The information required to be included in a death certificate would include the: name of the decedent; county or municipality in which the death occurred; date of death; sex of decedent; date of birth; and date of issuance and manner of death, providing this information is available.

9 The bill further clarifies that the sex of the decedent be recorded 10 to reflect the decedent's gender identity, as reported by the next of 11 kin or the best qualified person available, unless the person 12 completing the death certificate is presented with a document that memorializes the decedent's gender transition. If there is conflicting 13 14 information regarding the gender of the decedent, the bill defines 15 the specific documents which may be used to confirm the 16 decedent's gender.
