Requires assignment of unemployment claims handlers to legislative districts during COVID-19 pandemic state of emergency; appropriates \$1.8 million.

- The department shall make available to employees of legislative district offices:
- (1) view-only access to the unemployment claims system for use in their constituent services duties; and
 - (2) training on confidentiality and information security rules.
- The commissioner shall take necessary action to implement technological infrastructure upgrades to implement the provisions of this bill.

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2. There is appropriated from the General Fund \$1,800,000 to effectuate the provisions of this act.

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3. This act shall take effect thirty days after enactment.

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STATEMENT

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This bill requires the Department of Labor and Workforce Development to assign an unemployment claims handler to each legislative district during the state of emergency related to the COVID-19 pandemic. It also requires the department to make viewonly access to the unemployment claims system available to employees of legislative district offices, along with training on confidentiality and information security rules. The bill appropriates \$1,800,000 from the general fund to effectuate its purposes.
