SYNOPSIS

Requires financial aid award letter provided by institutions of higher education and certain proprietary schools be consistent with financial aid shopping sheet.

AN ACT concerning student financial aid and supplementing 1 P.L.1994, c.48 (C.18A:3B-1 et al.). 2 3 4 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 5 of New Jersey: 6 7 1. a. In the event that a public or independent institution of 8 higher education or a proprietary institution licensed to offer 9 academic degrees provides a financial aid award letter to a student, the financial aid award letter shall: 10 (1) be presented in a manner, and in such language, that is 11 substantially similar to that which is used in, and uses terms as 12 13 defined in, the financial aid shopping sheet provided to students 14 pursuant to section 2 of P.L.2019, c.201 (C.18A:3B-6b); (2) clearly display the estimated net cost to attend the 15 16 institution; 17 (3) clearly differentiate a student's eligibility for loans from a student's eligibility for other forms of financial aid, including 18 19 grants and scholarships; and 20 (4) include a clear statement that the acceptance or decline of 21 one or more loan offers shall not impact a student's eligibility for 22 any other grants or scholarships detailed in the student's financial 23 aid award letter. b. A student enrolled in a public or independent institution of 24 25 higher education or a proprietary institution licensed to offer 26 academic degrees shall be ineligible to receive any form of student 27 assistance from the State, including grants, scholarships, and loans, in the event that the institution or school fails to meet the 28 29 requirements established pursuant to subsection a. of this section, as 30 determined by the Secretary of Higher Education. 31 2. This act shall take effect ¹[on the 30th day after the date of 32 33 enactment] immediately and shall first apply to financial aid award
