**SYNOPSIS**

Allows issuance of temporary permits to applicants seeking licensure as teachers from New Jersey State Board of Cosmetology and Hairstyling.

**CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT**

1 AN ACT concerning applicants to teach cosmetology and  
2 hairstyling, and amending P.L.1984, c.205.

4 **BE IT ENACTED** *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*  
5 *of New Jersey:*

7 1. Section 26 of P.L.1984, c.205 (C.45:5B-26) is amended to  
8 read as follows:

9 26. Upon submitting satisfactory evidence of eligibility for  
10 **any** a practicing license or a license as a teacher, an applicant  
11 shall submit to the board a fee as required by the board. The  
12 applicant then shall be scheduled to sit for either the examination  
13 conducted by the board in the practice in which he is seeking a  
14 practicing license or the examination for licensure as a teacher.  
15 Upon scheduling, he shall be issued a temporary permit to engage in  
16 the practice for which the applicant is seeking a license or in  
17 teaching. The permit shall remain valid for a period of no more  
18 than 120 days and shall expire upon receipt of a newly issued  
19 license by the licensee. Only one temporary permit shall be issued  
20 to an applicant. **No temporary permit shall be issued to applicants**  
21 **awaiting scheduling of and results from the teacher examination.**

# STATEMENT

29

30 This bill allows an applicant seeking licensure as a teacher from  
31 the New Jersey State Board of Cosmetology and Hairstyling to  
32 receive a temporary permit while waiting for the teacher licensure  
33 examination to be scheduled. The temporary permit would be valid  
34 for 120 days and is to expire when the applicant receives a license  
35 as a teacher from the board. Currently, temporary permits are only  
36 allowed for applicants for practicing licenses issued by the board.

**EXPLANATION** – Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets **thus** in the above bill is  
not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

Matter underlined thus is new matter.
