

Requires DHS to stagger issuance dates of SNAP benefits to newly eligible enrollees.

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1 AN ACT concerning the issuance schedule of Supplemental 2 Nutrition Assistance Program benefits and supplementing Title 3 44 of the Revised Statutes. 4 5 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 6 of New Jersey: 7 8 1. a. The Division of Family Development in the Department 9 of Human Services shall implement an issuance schedule for newly 10 eligible enrollees of the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program 11 in which the issuance of benefits is staggered throughout the month, 12 provided that each household shall be issued benefits on or near the 13 same date once a month. The issuance schedule implemented by 14 the division shall comply with the federal regulations outlined at 7 15 CRF s.274.2. 16 b. The Commissioner of Human Services shall apply to the Food and Nutrition Service within the United States Department of 17 18 Agriculture for any necessary waivers or approvals to implement the provisions of this act. 19 20 c. As used in this act, "Supplemental Nutrition Assistance 21 Program" means the supplemental nutrition assistance program, 22 established pursuant to the federal "Food and Nutrition Act of 23 2008," Pub.L.88-525 (7 U.S.C.s.2011 et seq.). 24 25 The Commissioner of Human Services shall adopt rules and 2. regulations, pursuant to the "Administrative Procedure Act," 26 27 P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et seq.), as may be necessary to implement the provisions of this act. 28 29 30 This act shall take effect on the first day of the fourth month 3. 31 next following the date of enactment, but the Commissioner of 32 Human Services may take such anticipatory administrative action in 33 advance thereof as may be necessary for the implementation of this 34 act. 35 36 37 **STATEMENT** 38 39 This bill directs the Division of Family Development in the 40 Department of Human Services to implement an issuance schedule 41 for newly eligible enrollees of the Supplemental Nutrition 42 Assistance Program (SNAP), formerly known as the Food Stamp program, in which the issuance of benefits is staggered throughout 43 44 the month, provided that each household is issued benefits on or 45 near the same date once a month. The issuance schedule 46 implemented by the division is required to comply with the federal regulations outlined at 7 CRF s.274.2, which, among other things, 47 48 allows state agencies to stagger the issuance of benefits as long as

no more than 40 days elapses between the issuance of any two
allotments for a household.

The issuance of SNAP benefits refers to the date when a 3 household's SNAP benefits are uploaded onto their electronic 4 5 benefits transfer card each month and are available for use at authorized food retail locations. Currently, all SNAP enrollees in 6 New Jersey are issued benefits within the first five days of the 7 month. Under this bill, new enrollees would be issued benefits 8 9 through the month. In doing so, this bill codifies a best practice for 10 SNAP recommended by the Food Research and Action Center. By 11 staggering the issuance of benefits, the State can help reduce 12 congestion and product availability limitations at local grocery stores and SNAP offices during the existing five-day monthly 13 14 issuance period.

15 The bill also direct the Commissioner of Human Services to apply to the Food and Nutrition Service within the United States 16 Department of Agriculture for any necessary waivers or approvals 17 to implement the provisions of the bill. The bill is to take effect on 18 19 the first day of the fourth month next following the date of 20 enactment, but the commissioner may take such advance 21 anticipatory administrative action as may be necessary for the 22 implementation of the bill.
